HARVEST TYPE:

Areas 1 and 2: 322 acres of "automark" partial cut commercial thinning of good quality 50 to 67-year-old Douglas-fir, with a small component of Western hemlock, Red alder, Red cedar, and Noble fir. Volume to be removed in Area 1 is approximately 20 MBF/acre. Volume to be removed in Area 2 is approximately 13 MBF/acre. **Area 3 (in-sale R/W):** There is approximately 134 MBF to be

removed from 3 acres of in-sale R/W.

Sale Areas 1-3 are located in portions of Sections 23, 24, and 25, T5N, R6W, W.M., Clatsop County, Oregon.

This State timber sale contract requires that Purchaser comply with all laws, including the Endangered Species Act (ESA). Because of the lack of suitable habitat, the Department of Forestry (ODF) has not surveyed the sale area shown in Exhibit "A" for marbled murrelets. ODF has surveyed the sale area shown in Exhibit "A" for northern spotted owls. Results of the survey are on file with ODF, and are available for inspection upon request. Northern spotted owls were not detected in survey areas within or adjacent to this sale. ODF will continue conducting threatened or endangered species surveys in or around the sale area during the life of this contract. ODF does not guarantee that threatened or endangered species will not be found in or near the sale area. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found, ODF may take steps, including contract alteration or termination as provided in section 32 of the contract, if ODF believes those steps are necessary to protect the interests of State. Purchaser should take appropriate steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur.

PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS OF STATE TIMBER SALES NEED TO BE AWARE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY IS ENGAGED IN AN ACTIVE THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES SURVEY PROGRAM. AS PART OF THAT PROGRAM, ODF SURVEYS ITS LANDS ON A CONTINUING BASIS FOR LAND MANAGEMENT, SPECIES PROTECTION, RESEARCH, AND OTHER REASONS. PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS ARE REMINDED THAT ODF SURVEYING EFFORTS MAY TAKE PLACE DURING THE LIFE OF ANY TIMBER SALE CONTRACT, AND THAT THE DISCOVERY OF A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES IN THE VICINITY OF A TIMBER SALE MAY AFFECT OPERATIONS CONTEMPLATED UNDER THE CONTRACT. THIS INCLUDES TIMBER SALES THAT HAVE BEEN DETERMINED TO BE UNSUITABLE HABITAT OR NOT DETRIMENTAL TO HABITAT. This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2000 and 2001, using a survey protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. There were no observations of northern spotted owls during any of these surveys. The sale is not affected by any known northern spotted owl activity centers. ODF will continue to conduct northern spotted owl surveys during the life of the contract, in order to ensure adequate time for operations under the contract.

This sale does not contain suitable habitat for marbled murrelets. Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary.

Current northern spotted owl surveys are valid until March 15, 2004. The sale will be resurveyed during the 2002 northern spotted owl survey season. Once completed, these surveys will be valid until March 15, 2005. Seasonal restrictions apply to Areas 1 and 2 of the sale until additional northern spotted owl surveys are complete in 2002, as outlined in the contract.
