HARVEST TYPE: This timber sale is a regeneration harvest containing approximately 63 acres in 2 adjacent units of predominately 120-year-old Douglas-fir timber.

SALE LOCATION: The timber sale is located in portions of Sections 14 and 23, T24S, R12W, W.M., Coos County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: Coos Bay to North Bay Drive; proceed 2.3 miles to Larson Way; proceed 3.7 miles to the 3000 Road; proceed 3.8 miles to the 3400 Road. Turn left on the 3170 Road – this intersection is Point C on the Exhibit A.

There is no project amortization. ODF will **not** reduce the price of a species to amortize the project work. Instead ODF will credit PURCHASER's timber account in the amount of \$29,928.70 after the project work is completed and accepted, as described in the section titled, "Credit for Project Work."

The timber sale areas contain negligible volumes of other logs to be paid for at the prices in Section 44.

PERFORMANCE SECURITY: 20% of bid value (unknown) **or** the total value of the project work (\$30,000), whichever is greater. Actual bond amount will be rounded up to an even \$1,000 unit.

HARVEST METHOD: 100% cable logging with full suspension over the timber sale area when adequate deflection is available; otherwise one-end suspension is required.

PROJECTS: Approximately 1,300 feet of road construction and 6,400 feet of road reconstruction; construction of two landings; and a 1,000 cubic yard stockpile.

THREATENED AND
ENDANGERED SPECIES
INFORMATION: This State timber sale contract requires that Purchaser comply with all laws, including the Endangered Species Act (ESA). This sale is located within an area covered by a Habitat Conservation Plan approved by U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS). The Incidental Take Permit (ITP) associated with this HCP covers northern spotted owls.
The Department of Forestry (ODF) has surveyed the sale area shown in Exhibit "A" for marbled murrelets. Results of the survey are on file with ODF, and are available for inspection upon request. Surveys did not indicate occupancy by marbled murrelets within the sale area. ODF is engaged in an active threatened or endangered species survey process and does not guarantee that a threatened or endangered species will not be found as a result of those surveys or the surveys of others that might impact this sale. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found, ODF may take steps, including contract alteration or termination as provided in Section 32 of the contract, if ODF believes those steps are necessary to protect the interests of State.

Prospective purchasers are encouraged to contact the ODF wildlife information coordinator (503-945-7374) for further information or questions relative to threatened or endangered species survey information.

SPECIAL REMARKS: **SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SEE SECTION 39.**
The acreage for the timber sale was determined using orthophoto imagery on the ArcView GIS program.
Minor species in Areas I and II are reserved from harvesting.
The total price for hardwoods shall be paid prior to log hauling.
Log hauling shall not be allowed on dirt spurs from October 15 through May 15, annually. All log decks must be removed by October 15.
Thirty-one snags are to be created per Section 58 of the contract.

SALE OBJECTIVES: The objective of this timber sale is to provide revenue for the State School Fund and to create a young age class stand in accordance with the Balanced Landscape Approach of the Elliott State Forest Management Plan.

PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS OF STATE TIMBER SALES NEED TO BE AWARE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY IS ENGAGED IN AN ACTIVE THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES SURVEY PROGRAM. AS PART OF THAT PROGRAM, ODF SURVEYS ITS LANDS ON A CONTINUING BASIS FOR LAND MANAGEMENT, SPECIES PROTECTION, RESEARCH, AND OTHER REASONS. PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS ARE REMINDED THAT ODF SURVEYING EFFORTS MAY TAKE PLACE DURING THE LIFE OF ANY TIMBER SALE CONTRACT, AND THAT THE DISCOVERY OF A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES IN THE VICINITY OF A TIMBER SALE MAY AFFECT OPERATIONS CONTEMPLATED UNDER THE CONTRACT. THIS INCLUDES TIMBER SALES THAT HAVE BEEN DETERMINED TO BE UNSUITABLE HABITAT OR NOT DETRIMENTAL TO HABITAT. PLEASE REFER TO SECTIONS 30, 32, AND 33 OF YOUR CONTRACT PROSPECTUS, OR CONTACT OUR WILDLIFE INFORMATION COORDINATOR AT (503) 945-7374 FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

This sale is located within the Elliott State Forest, which is covered by a Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) agreement executed with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Incidental Take Permit (ITP) associated with this HCP covers northern spotted owls. This sale does not affect any known active northern spotted owl activity center or core areas.

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets. This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in 1999 and 2000, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group. There were detections of marbled murrelets during three of these surveys; however, there were no subcanopy detections or other indications of occupied behaviors. There are no Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within ¼ mile of this sale.

There are no seasonal restrictions associated with northern spotted owls or marbled murrelets for this sale. There are no marbled murrelet surveys currently planned within ¼ mile of this sale.
