PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS OF STATE TIMBER SALES NEED TO BE AWARE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY IS ENGAGED IN AN ACTIVE THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES SURVEY PROGRAM. AS PART OF THAT PROGRAM, ODF SURVEYS ITS LANDS ON A CONTINUING BASIS FOR LAND MANAGEMENT, SPECIES PROTECTION, RESEARCH, AND OTHER REASONS. PROSPECTIVE PURCHASERS ARE REMINDED THAT ODF SURVEYING EFFORTS MAY TAKE PLACE DURING THE LIFE OF ANY TIMBER SALE CONTRACT, AND THAT THE DISCOVERY OF A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES IN THE VICINITY OF A TIMBER SALE MAY AFFECT OPERATIONS CONTEMPLATED UNDER THE CONTRACT. Areas 2 – 5 of this sale contain suitable northern spotted owl habitat, and were surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2001 and 2002, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. There was one nighttime observation of a spotted owl in 2002. Follow-up surveys did not yield any further observations, and the owl was determined to be a non-territorial single, or "floater," owl. This sale is not affected by any known northern spotted owl activity centers. Northern spotted owl surveys will continue around the sale area during the life of the contract, as part of ODF's survey of planned management activities.

This sale contains no potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets. Surveys for murrelets are not necessary.

Northern spotted owl surveys are valid until March 15, 2005. All timber on Areas 2 – 5 must be felled by this date. There are no other seasonal restrictions or felling deadlines associated with northern spotted owls or marbled murrelets for this sale.
