Treat 40 acres of slash on Area I by creating planting spots with an excavator.

Expend 20 hours of shovel time for blocking skid roads.

Elevation is 1200 to 2900 feet in the timber sale area. The access roads are 2800 to 3500 feet.

A written plan has been prepared for working within 100 feet of Type F streams.

Top 120 trees.

Cable yarding up to 1,700 feet slope distance is required on portions of the timber sale area. Use of intermediate supports should be anticipated on some cable yarding roads.

Acres were determined using a planimeter and Ortho photos.

SALE OBJECTIVES:

#### **Habitat Suitability**

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

## Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2001 and 2002, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service<sup>1</sup>. There was one observation of a female northern spotted owl during one of these surveys. There were no further observations of spotted owls during follow-up surveys, and the owl was determined to be a non-territorial single, or "floater" owl. A third year of surveys will be conducted in 2003.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2001 and 2002, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>2</sup>. Surveys were expanded in 2002 to enhance the survey effort. There were no observations of marbled murrelets during any of these surveys.

#### **Known T&E Resources**

There are no known northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

#### **Operational Considerations**

No harvesting operations will be allowed on the sale from March 15, 2003 until August 31, 2003, or until northern spotted owl surveys have been completed. After northern spotted owl surveys are completed in 2003, survey results will be valid until March 15, 2006. All timber should be felled by March 15, 2006.

By ODF policy, marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 2008.

## **Future Survey Plans**

The sale will be surveyed for northern spotted owls again in 2003. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.

ODF has no plans for further survey for marbled murrelets of this sale or in the vicinity of this sale during the contract period.
