## Habitat Suitability

This sale does not contain potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale is beyond the known inland range of the marbled murrelet.

## Survey Results

Survey for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

## Known T&E Resources

This sale is within 1.3 miles of three northern spotted owl activity centers. A biological assessment has been completed for this sale. This assessment concludes that the sale has a low risk of negatively affecting spotted owl sites because it is not modifying suitable habitat.

U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reviewed a preliminary biological assessment for this sale, and communicated concern about a risk of incidental take to one of the three spotted owl sites. Following their comments, all suitable habitat was removed from the sale. U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has not reviewed the final biological assessment.

## **Operational Considerations**

There are no seasonal operating restrictions or felling deadlines associated with threatened or endangered species for this sale.

## Future Survey Plans

There are no future survey plans for this sale. However, ODF will continue monitoring surveys at northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.3 miles of the sale area, during the life of the contract.
