HARVEST TYPE: Clearcut harvest containing approximately 58 net acres of 40-year-old Douglas-fir and red alder timber.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Section 12, T10S, R10W, W.M., Lincoln County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: From Philomath, travel 32 miles west on Highway 20 to Sams Creek Road. Turn right and proceed north on Sams Creek Road about 6 miles to Hamer Road, which is on the left just before crossing the Siletz River. Turn left on Hamer Road and go about 1 mile to Hollywood Hills Road. There is a locked gate on this road. (Keys can be checked out at the District Headquarters in Philomath.) Turn left and drive about 1 mile south to Point B and the sale area.

There is no project amortization. ODF will **not** reduce the price of a species to amortize the project work. Instead ODF will credit PURCHASER's timber account in the amount of \$10,979 after the project work is completed and accepted, as described in the section titled, "Credit for Project Work."

The timber sale area contains negligible volumes of other logs to be paid for at the prices in Section 44.

PERFORMANCE SECURITY: 20% of bid value (unknown) **or** the total value of the project work (\$11,000), whichever is greater. Actual bond amount will be rounded up to an even \$1,000 unit.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Net and gross acres for the timber sale area were determined using digital orthophotos and GIS.

Access to the timber sale area is controlled with a locked gate at Point A. Keys are available from the West Oregon District Office at Philomath.

Fire trail construction is required.

SALE OBJECTIVES: The objective is to remove a Douglas-fir stand severely infected with Swiss needle cast in order to regenerate with resistant tree species.

The information shown on the Exhibit "A" map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale does not contain suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. The sale does contain potential habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

Northern spotted owl surveys are not necessary for this sale.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2001 and 2002, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group¹. There were no observations of marbled murrelets during any of these surveys.

Known T&E Resources

There are no known northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

Operational Considerations

Current marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 2008.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale.
