Habitat Suitability

This sale contains suitable habitat for northern spotted owls, and Areas 1 and 3 contain suitable habitat for marbled murrelets. A tree containing branches that could potentially provide nesting platforms for marbled murrelets was found late in the sale planning process on the edge of Area 2.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2002 and 2003, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service¹. There were several observations of northern spotted owls within 1.5 miles of the sale area during these surveys. All of these observations were associated with a known activity center greater than 1.5 miles from the sale area.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted on Areas 1 and 3 in 2002 and 2003, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group². There were no observations of marbled murrelets during any of these surveys.

The tree on the edge of Area 2 was searched on March 31, 2003, by a tree climber with experience in finding marbled murrelet nests. No evidence of nesting murrelets (past or present) was found.

Known T&E Resources

There are no known northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

Operational Considerations

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2006. Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 2009.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2006.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale. However, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
