Habitat Suitability

This sale contains suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. It does not contain suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls three times in 2002, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service¹. There were no observations of northern spotted owls during any of these surveys. In accordance with the protocol, the sale is being surveyed again for spotted owls in 2003. Two of the three scheduled survey visits have been completed with no observations of northern spotted owls.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary.

Known T&E Resources

There are no known northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

Operational Considerations

The second year of a two-year survey protocol is currently being conducted on this sale. This sale should not be sold until completion of the 2003 northern spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles of the sale area. Once northern spotted owl surveys are complete, the results will be valid until March 15, 2006. All timber should be felled by March 15, 2006.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale after 2003. However, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
