HARVEST TYPE: Regeneration harvest with wildlife emphasis of approximately 42 acres of 92- to 110-year-old, mature second-growth Douglas-fir sawtimber.

SALE LOCATION: The timber sale is located in portions of Section 6, T23S, R10W, W.M., Coos County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: The timber sale area is located approximately 38 miles northeast of Coos Bay via Allegany, West Fork Millicoma Road, and the 2000, 7000, and 7300 Roads.

Habitat Conservation Plan Area

This sale is within an area covered by a Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) approved by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Incidental Take Permit (ITP) for the HCP covers northern spotted owls. Under the provisions of this HCP, surveys are not required for northern spotted owls.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2002 and 2003, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group¹. Marbled murrelets were observed during one survey in each year. Behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed.

Known T&E Resources

A portion of this sale is within 0.25 miles of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA).

Operational Considerations

Although a portion of the sale is within 0.25 miles of a MMMA, the Area Biologist has determined that seasonal operating restrictions are not necessary because adequate sound buffering of the occupied stand will be provided by a non-habitat forested buffer and prominent ridge that is located between the MMMA and the sale area.

By ODF policy, marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2009.

Future Survey Plans

There are no future survey plans for this sale.
