- (4) Enter Purchaser's business name and address as it appears on the Contract.
- (5) Minimum Scaling Specifications. Review Section 2040 or 2045, "Log Removal," of the Contract. Species, or combined species can be separate entries. Information serves as a basis for scaling (see also Items (13) thru (17)), and is required to show existence on the sale. **PerM** (per MBF). **SUM** (lump sum material). **SUB** (submerchantable material. <u>CLEARING</u>. This work shall consist of clearing, removing, and disposing of all trees, snags, down timber, brush, surface objects, and protruding obstructions within the clearing limits.

Where clearing limits have not been staked, the "Road Brushing Specifications" in Exhibit D shall apply. Clearing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under any road embankment sections. Clearing debris shall not be left lodged against standing trees.

All danger trees, leaners, and snags outside the clearing limits which could fall and hit the road shall be felled.

GRUBBING. This work shall consist of the removal or digging out of stumps and protruding objects.

All stumps shall be completely removed within the limits of required grubbing. Stumps overhanging cutslopes shall be removed. Grubbing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under any road embankment sections. Grubbing debris shall not be left lodged against standing trees. Grubbing classifications are as follows:

New construction - From the top of the cutslope to the toe of the fill.

Improvements and reconstructions - 4 feet back from the shoulder of the subgrade or ditch, whichever is widest, or as marked in the field.

<u>CLEARING AND GRUBBING DISPOSAL</u>. Scatter through openings in the timber outside of the cleared right-of-way, except areas where end-haul is required.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Drainage shall be changed to Ditch if "WINTER AND WET WEATHER OPTION" is chosen.

#### FOREST ROAD SPECIFICATIONS

<u>EXCAVATION</u>. Excavation and grading shall not be done when weather and/or ground conditions are such that damage will result to existing subgrade or cause excessive erosion.

Excavation shall conform to STATE-engineered lines, grades, dimensions, and plans when provided.

All suitable excavated material shall be used where possible for the formation of fills, shoulders, and drainage structure backfills. Embankment materials shall be free of woody debris, brush, muck, sod, frozen material, and other deleterious materials. All fills and drainage structure backfills shall be machine compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit D.

Unless road design plans show otherwise, all roads shall be on a balanced cross section, except when the slope is over 50 percent, the road shall be on full bench for the width specified.

Excess excavation shall not be sidecast where material will enter a stream course or where material will accumulate in areas deemed a high landslide hazard location by STATE.

ROAD WIDTH LIMITATIONS. PURCHASER shall obtain advance written approval from STATE to construct the road to a greater width than specified. Extra subgrade width shall be required for:

Fill Widening. Add to each fill shoulder 1 foot for fills 3 feet to 6 feet high; 2 feet for fills over 6 feet high.

<u>Curve Widening</u>. Widen the inside shoulder of all curves as follows: 400 divided by the radius of the curve equals the amount of extra width.

#### DRAINAGE

<u>Ditch</u>. Construct "V" ditch 3 feet wide and to a depth of 1 foot below subgrade. Subgrade shall be crowned at 4 to 6 percent.

Outslope. Road subgrade shall be outsloped at 4 to 6 percent.

<u>TURNOUTS</u>. Increase roadbed width an additional 8 feet for both subgrade and surfacing. Length shall be at least 25 feet, or as staked on the ground, plus 25-foot approaches at each end.

Location: As marked in the field.

#### ADDITIONAL ROAD IMPROVEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSTRUCTIONS

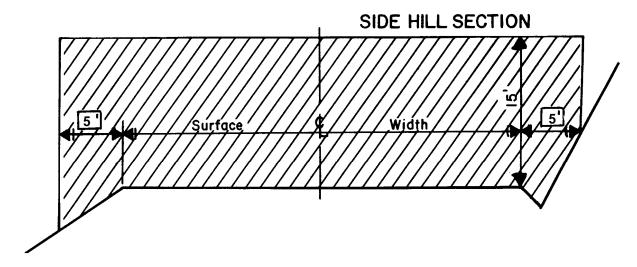
- A to B A cat shall be used to remove the waterbars and smooth the road surface. The road shall be uniformly bladed with a grader in order to achieve a smooth running surface.
- C to D This road shall be constructed with a balance cut/fill on sideslopes less than 45 percent. The remainder of the road shall be constructed as a full bench design. All end-haul material out of the full bench areas shall be used in the road prism as shown in the road design. No hauling of end-haul material out of the road construction area shall be necessary.
- E to F This road starts at Station 16+30 of the road segment C to D. There will be no end-haul off of this road construction.
- G to H Material taken out for the landing at Point H shall be drifted toward Point G and used for fill in order to bring the grade up around the switchback. There shall be no end-haul off of this road construction.
- J A cat shall be used to clear out a spot for the landing at this point. Small alder and fir trees shall be removed to clear the landing area.
- K A large gully shall be filled in to construct a landing at this point. In order to fill this gully, the outer portion of the landing area shall be cut down and the material drifted back into the gully. If additional material is necessary to fill the gully, the material shall be taken from the cutbank adjacent to this point.
- L to M This is a road widening project on the 3400 Road. A portion of the material generated from the widening (approximately 1,000 yds.) shall be hauled to the existing landing at Point P and treated as specified in Exhibit D, "End-Hauling Requirements." The remainder of the material shall be hauled to the waste area at Point Q and treated as specified in Exhibit D, "End-Hauling Requirements." Once the widening is complete, the road shall be surfaced according to Exhibit E, "Road Surfacing."
- N to O This is a road widening project on the 3000 Road. The road up to the landing above this segment shall be cut off in order to gain adequate width for the 3000 Road. The existing culvert in this road shall be saved and kept in place. The material generated from this widening shall be hauled to Point R and treated as specified in Exhibit D, "End-Hauling Requirements." Once the widening is complete, the road shall be surfaced according to Exhibit E, "Road Surfacing."

# ADDITIONAL ROAD IMPROVEMENT/CONSTRUCTION INSTRUCTIONS (WINTER AND WET WEATHER OPTION ONLY)

- A to B The drainage on this road shall be changed to a ditch, and culverts shall be added in locations as directed by STATE. These locations shall be determined after the road is opened. The subgrade shall be compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit F, "Compaction Requirements."
- C to D The drainage on this road shall be changed to a ditch. A culvert shall be added at Point C and at a location determined after the road is opened. The subgrade shall be compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit F, "Compaction Requirements."
- E to F The drainage on this road shall be changed to a ditch. A culvert shall be added at Point E. The subgrade shall be compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit F, "Compaction Requirements."
- G to H The drainage on this road shall be changed to a ditch. A culvert shall be added at Point G. The subgrade shall be compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit F, "Compaction Requirements."

#### **REQUIREMENTS**

Brush and trees shall be cut to a maximum height of 6 inches above the ground surface or obstructions such as rocks or existing stumps.

Debris resulting from the brushing operation shall be removed from the roadway, cutslope, ditches, and water courses within 72 hours and may be scattered downslope from the road or placed in other stable locations, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

#### **End-Haul Areas General Requirements**

Material shall not be intentionally side cast.

Clearing and grubbing debris shall be end-hauled.

When blasting is required, it shall be accomplished using timing devices, delayed charges, low intensity shots, or other suitable means to contain as much material as possible within the road prism.

#### Containment

Full containment: The amount of material lost over the outside edge of the road shall not exceed 6 inches in depth measured perpendicular to the natural ground slope. Pioneer excavation shall be removed by digging, loading, and hauling rather than by pushing or scraping methods.

Trees and stumps may have up to 12 inches of material directly above them. Any amount of material exceeding the containment requirements shall be removed by whatever means necessary and end-hauled to a designated waste area.

#### Waste Area Location

- (1) Fill area between Stations 19+00 to 20+00 on road segment C to D.
- (2) Points P, Q, and R

#### Waste Area Treatment

- Deposit at waste area, spread evenly, compact, and provide adequate drainage.

#### CRUSHED ROCK SPECIFICATIONS

<u>Materials</u>. The material shall be fragments of rock or other hard, durable particles crushed to the required size and a filler of finely crushed stone, sand, or other finely divided mineral matter. The material shall be free from vegetation and lumps of clay.

<u>Quality and Grading Requirements</u>. The stone base materials shall be crushed rock, including sand. River gravel shall not be used.

The material from which base material is produced or manufactured shall conform to the general requirements of Section 2630 of the "Standard Specifications for Highway Construction" prepared by the Highway Division, Oregon Department of Transportation, and shall meet the following test requirements:

#### **ROCK ACCOUNTABILITY**

The rock shall meet the quality and size specifications in Exhibit E. A sample of the rock shall be supplied to STATE for testing and approval prior to rocking. PURCHASER shall obtain subgrade approval from STATE prior to rocking. Rocking shall be limited to periods when weather conditions are acceptable to STATE and when sediments will not enter streams.

Rock accountability shall be determined by the following method, as directed by STATE. STATE shall be given 24 hours' notice prior to rocking.

<u>Load Records</u>. Notify STATE before spreading the rock and maintain a record of all rock delivered for spreading. Make the record available for STATE inspection. A report listing the amount of rock delivered the prior month must be submitted no later than the 15th of each month.

#### EXHIBIT "F"

#### COMPACTION AND PROCESSING REQUIREMENTS

<u>Subgrade</u>. Subgrade surfaces of the road segments listed below shall be graded and compacted prior to rocking. Compaction shall be accomplished by traveling all surfaces from shoulder to shoulder until visible deformation ceases, or in the case of a sheepsfoot roller, the roller "walks out." At least 3 passes shall be made over the entire width and length of the road. A pass is defined as traveling a road section in one direction and then back over that same section again. Compaction shall be accomplished by using the approved equipment listed below or others approved by STATE:

Subgrade shall be crowned at 4 to 6 percent unless otherwise specified.

<u>Crushed Rock</u>. The rock shall be uniformly mixed and spread in layers on the approved roadbed. Each layer of crushed rock shall be moistened or dried to a uniform moisture content suitable for maximum compaction and compacted in layers not to exceed 6 inches in depth. When more than 1 layer is required, each shall be shaped and compacted before the succeeding layer is placed. Any irregularities or depressions that develop during compaction of the top layer shall be corrected by loosening the material at these places and adding or removing material until the surface is smooth and uniform. Each layer shall be compacted with a minimum of 3 passes over the entire width and length of the road. A pass is defined as traveling a road section in one direction and then back over that same section again. Compaction shall be accomplished by using the approved equipment listed below or others approved by STATE:

Rock shall be compacted and processed during the same project period it is spread, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Rock shall be crowned at 4 to 6 percent unless otherwise specified.

#### COMPACTION EQUIPMENT OPTIONS

<u>Vibratory Rollers</u>. The drum shall have a smooth surface, a diameter not less than 48 inches, a width not less than 58 inches, and a turning radius of 15 feet or less. Vibration frequency shall be regulated in steps to 1400, 1500, and 1600 VPM, corresponding to engine speeds of 1575, 1690, and 1800 RPM. The centrifugal force developed shall be 7 tons at 1600 VPM. It shall be activated by a power unit of not less than 25 horsepower. The vibratory roller shall be self-propelled and operated at speeds ranging from 0.9 miles to 1.8 miles per hour, as directed by STATE.

<u>Dump Trucks</u>. Dump trucks shall be routed over the entire cross section of fill layers.

<u>Crawler Tractors</u>. D-7 Caterpillar or equivalent (or larger).

#### **CULVERT SPECIFICATIONS**

All culvert materials shall be furnished and installed by PURCHASER, unless otherwise specified in the contract. Culverts shall be constructed of corrugated galvanized iron or steel, aluminized steel, or polyethylene and shall conform to the material and fabricating requirements of Sections 2410 and 2420 of the "Standard Specifications for Highway Construction" prepared by the Highway Division of the Oregon State Department of Transportation. Corrugation types and shapes other than those meeting the above minimum Highway requirements, shall be approved in writing by STATE.

Culverts shall be located according to the alignment and grade as shown on the Plan and Profile, and/or as staked in the field, or as stipulated in special instructions.

The STATE Representative shall determine final culvert locations and stake the locations in the field prior to installation.

Culvert grade shall slope away from ditch grade at least 2 percent unless otherwise specified.

Culverts less than 36 inches in diameter shall be installed with the lock seam on the inlet end placed within 45 degrees of the bottom of the trench.

The foundation and trench walls for all culverts shall be free from logs, stumps, limbs, stones, and other objects which would dent or damage the pipe. The culvert trench shall be excavated 3 pipe diameters wide to permit compaction and working on each side of the pipe. Tamping shall be done in 6-inch lifts, 1 pipe diameter each side of the pipe to 95 percent density or over. Bedrock shall be excavated as required to provide a uniform foundation for the full length of the culvert.

A bedding of granulated material or crushed rock as specified shall be placed to provide a wide band of support and to transmit the load from above evenly over the entire length of the pipe.

Backfill shall consist of granulated material, crushed rock, or job-excavated soil free of stumps, limbs, rocks, or other objects which would damage the pipe.

Transporting of the pipe shall be done carefully. Dragging or allowing free fall from trucks or into trenches shall not be permitted.

Joining shall be done with bands of like material and corrugations. Manufacturers' instructions shall be followed for prefabricated pipe assembly.

Polyethylene joints shall be made with split couplings, corrugated to engage the pipe corrugations, and shall engage a minimum of 4 corrugations, 2 on each side of the pipe joint.

A manufacturer's certification that the product was manufactured, tested, and supplied in accordance with this specification shall be furnished to the Project Engineer upon request.

#### **CULVERT SPECIFICATIONS**

Minimum height of cover over top of culvert to subgrade when road is to be rocked shall be as follows: 12" for galvanized or aluminized steel culverts 18" to 36", 18" for galvanized or aluminized steel culverts 42" to 96", and 12" for polyethylene culverts (add 6" for roads which will not be rocked). Minimum vertical cover for other steel designs shall be as specified by STATE.

Lengths of individual culvert sections shall be not less than 10 feet, unless otherwise provided for in special instructions.

The ends of each culvert shall be free of logs and debris which would restrict the free flow of water. The intake end of relief culverts shall be provided with a sediment catching basin 3 feet in diameter at the bottom. The outlet end of any culvert which would allow water to erode embankment soil shall be provided with a half round or other approved slope protection device. Construct the lead-off ditch away from the culvert outlet where the slope gradient restricts the free flow of water.

Following are the minimum standard gauges for pipe and coupling bands. Some culverts may require different gauges and may be found in the culvert listing.

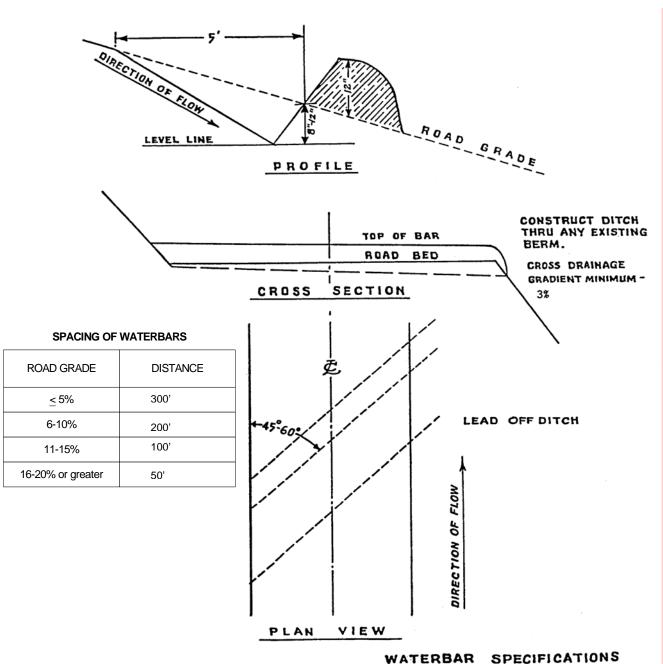
