

- (4) Enter Purchaser's business name and address as it appears on the Contract.
- (5) Minimum Scaling Specifications. Review Section 2040 or 2045, "Log Removal," of the Contract. Species, or combined species can be separate entries. Information serves as a basis for scaling (see also Items (13) thru (17)), and is required to show existence on the sale. **PerM** (per MBF). **SUM** (lump sum material). **SUB** (submerchantable material. SUB, as used by the State, references that material containing at least 10 bf (net) but less than the lower merchantable net volume limit or grade requirements for other merchantable (PerM) entries. PerM, SUM, and Sub must be indicated by checking the appropriate column. Species with the same specifications and value are combined into one entry. FOREST ROAD SPECIFICATIONS

<u>CLEARING</u>. This work shall consist of clearing, removing, and disposing of all trees, Snags, Down Timber, brush, surface objects, and protruding obstructions within the clearing limits.

Where clearing limits have not been marked, the "Road Brushing Specifications" in Exhibit D shall apply. Clearing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under any road embankment sections. Clearing debris shall not be left lodged against standing trees.

All danger trees, leaners, and Snags outside the clearing limits which could fall and hit the road shall be felled.

GRUBBING. This work shall consist of the removal or digging out of stumps and protruding objects.

All stumps shall be completely removed within the limits of required grubbing. Stumps overhanging cutslopes shall be removed. Grubbing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under any road embankment sections. Grubbing debris shall not be left lodged against standing trees. Grubbing classifications are as follows:

New construction - From the top of the cutslope to the toe of the fill.

Improvements and reconstructions - 4 feet back from the shoulder of the subgrade or ditch, whichever is widest, or as marked in the field.

Trees outside the clearing limits shall not be felled unless approved in writing by STATE.

Sidecast pullback – From top of pullback to toe of pullback.

<u>CLEARING AND GRUBBING DISPOSAL</u>. Scatter through openings in the timber outside of the cleared right-of-way, except areas where end-haul is required.

FOREST ROAD SPECIFICATIONS

<u>EXCAVATION</u>. Excavation and grading shall not be done when weather and/or ground conditions are such that damage will result to existing subgrade or cause excessive erosion.

Excavation shall conform to STATE-engineered lines, grades, dimensions, and plans when provided.

All suitable excavated material shall be used where possible for the formation of fills, shoulders, and drainage structure backfills. Embankment materials shall be free of woody debris, brush, muck, sod, frozen material, and other deleterious materials. All fills and drainage structure backfills shall be machine compacted according to the specifications in Exhibit E.

Unless road design plans show otherwise, all roads shall be on a balanced cross section, except when the slope is over 50 percent, the road shall be on full bench for the width specified.

Excess excavation shall not be sidecast where material will enter a stream course or where material will accumulate in areas deemed a high landslide hazard location by STATE.

Bank excavation and sidecast pullback on a project road segment shall be completed prior to subgrade approval.

ROAD WIDTH LIMITATIONS. PURCHASER shall obtain advance written approval from STATE to construct the road to a greater width than specified. Extra subgrade width shall be required for:

Fill Widening. Add to each fill shoulder 1 foot for fills 3 feet to 6 feet high; 2 feet for fills over 6 feet high.

<u>Curve Widening</u>. Widen the inside shoulder of all curves as follows: 400 divided by the radius of the curve equals the amount of extra width.

DRAINAGE

<u>Ditch</u>. Construct "V" ditch 3 feet wide and to a depth of 1.5 foot below subgrade. Subgrade shall be crowned at 4 to 6 percent. Construct ditchouts away from subgrade at locations marked in the field.

Outslope. Road subgrade shall be outsloped at 4 to 6 percent.

<u>TURNOUTS</u>. Increase roadbed width an additional 8 feet for both subgrade and surfacing. Length shall be at least 25 feet, or as staked on the ground, plus 25-foot approaches at each end.

Location: Intervisible but not greater than 750 feet.

<u>TURNAROUNDS</u>. Increase subgrade width an additional 30 feet for a length of 16 feet with 20' radius returns at locations marked in the field.

ADDITIONAL ROAD IMPROVEMENT INSTRUCTIONS

Between Points A and B:

- -- From Station 89+95 to 91+85, widen road 4 feet left.
- -- At Station 103+75, remove rock slough from ditch.
- -- Widen the subgrade as marked in the field and specified in Exhibit M between the following stations: 199+40 to 199+55, 202+50 to 202+90, 547+95 to 548+35, 559+70 to 560+20, and 603+40 to 604+30.
- -- Widen road 6 feet into cutbank between the following stations: 326+40 to 327+10, 356+40 to 357+25, and 486+95 to 488+05.
- -- From Station 350+95 to 351+60, widen road 5 feet right.
- -- From Station 351+60 to 352+80, widen road 10 feet right and excavate the edge of the fill to a slope of 1:1 for 2 feet.
- -- From Station 357+25 to 358+90, widen road 8 feet right.
- -- From Station 361+60 to 364+30 and Station 400+00 to 400+75, use pit-run rock to raise shoulder to subgrade elevation with a crown slope of 4 percent.
- -- From Station 551+85 to 552+25, widen road 4 feet right.
- -- Between Stations 615+60 to 619+00, 621+55 to 622+80, and 640+65 to 642+50, reconstruct road as marked in the field and instructed by STATE.

At Station 617+00 and Station 617+80, construct free-draining fills to a minimum depth of 4 feet. Widths of the free drain fills shall be 33 feet at Station 617+00 and 19 feet at Station 617+80, as marked in the field. The free drains shall be constructed according to the specifications in Exhibit N with drain rock specified in Exhibit E. Drawings are available at the Tillamook District Office.

Pull back sidecast material as marked in the field and according to the specifications in Exhibit J between the following stations: 389+60 to 390+45, 390+45 to 391+20, 434+00 to 439+40, 497+25 to 498+25, 543+35 to 544+35, 546+20 to 547+00, 549+05 to 549+70, 550+30 to 551+50, 552+60 to 556+00, 556+60 to 557+60, 561+00 to 561+35, 561+70 to 561+90, 563+75 to 564+60, 565+60 to 566+50, 567+30 to 570+75, 593+35 to 594+10, 599+30 to 600+10, 636+70 to 638+70, 639+60 to 640+20, 652+45 to 652+90, 662+45 to 664+80, and 666+60 to 667+15.

Between Points C and D:

At Station 0+00, reconstruct and widen junction with A to B as marked in the field.

From Stations 16+95 to 18+45, reduce road grade to 20 percent favorable by cutting near Station 18+45 and filling near Station 16+95 as marked in the field and instructed by STATE.

Between Points O to P:

PURCHASER shall not be required to maintain the junction with the connecting road at Station 6+20.

Fill in road dips at Stations 20+30, 23+75, 25+30, 26+60, 33+35, and 38+75 as marked in the field and instructed by STATE.


ADDITIONAL ROAD VACATING INSTRUCTIONS

Project No. 4 – Road Vacating Between Points W and X:

- All vacating activities, including felling of trees, shall be done only when a STATE Representative is present on site. STATE shall be given at least 48 hours' notice prior to any vacating activity.
- At Station 0+00, construct a tank trap as specified in Exhibit I.
- Pull back sidecast material from Station 0+00 to Station 8+00 as marked in the field and specified in Exhibit J.
- At Station 0+90, construct a ditchout across the road as marked in the field.

ROAD BRUSHING SPECIFICATIONS





REQUIREMENTS

Unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE, between Stations 0+00 and 325+45 (Points A to B), brush and trees less than 8 inches DBH shall be cut to a height of 6 inches or less above the ground surface or obstructions such as rocks or existing stumps. On all other road segments, brushing shall include the removal all trees, regardless of diameter, and brush. Brushing on project road segments shall be completed prior to subgrade approval.

Debris resulting from the brushing operation shall be removed from the roadway, cutslope, ditches, and watercourses within 72 hours and may be scattered downslope from the road or placed in other stable locations, unless otherwise approved by STATE.

Trees outside the clearing limits shall not be felled unless approved in writing by STATE.

End-Haul Areas General Requirements

Material shall not be intentionally side cast.

Clearing and grubbing debris shall be end-hauled.

When blasting is required, it shall be accomplished using timing devices, delayed charges, low intensity shots, or other suitable means to contain as much material as possible within the road prism.

Containment

Full containment: The amount of material lost over the outside edge of the road shall not exceed 6 inches in depth measured perpendicular to the natural ground slope. Pioneer excavation shall be removed by digging, loading, and hauling rather than by pushing or scraping methods.

Trees and stumps may have up to 12 inches of material directly above them. Any amount of material exceeding the containment requirements shall be removed by whatever means necessary and end-hauled to a designated waste area.

Waste Area Location

As shown on Exhibit A and as marked in the field.

Waste Area Treatment

Deposit at waste area, spread evenly, compact, and provide adequate drainage. Pile woody debris separate from other waste material.

EXHIBIT E

CRUSHED ROCK SPECIFICATIONS

<u>Materials</u>. The material shall be fragments of rock or other hard, durable particles crushed to the required size and a filler of finely crushed stone, sand, or other finely divided mineral matter. The material shall be free from vegetation and lumps of clay.

<u>Quality and Grading Requirements</u>. The stone base materials shall be crushed rock, including sand. River gravel shall not be used.

The material from which base material is produced or manufactured shall meet the following test requirements:

Hardness - Test Method AASHTO T 96 35% Maximum

Durability - Test Method ODOT TM 208

Passing No. 20 Sieve: 30% Maximum Sediment Height: 3" Maximum

The rock crusher shall be calibrated to produce rock as specified in Exhibit E. Prior to the commencement of production crushing, PURCHASER shall sample, test, and provide rock test results meeting STATE specifications. STATE may then sample and test crushed rock for approval to proceed. PURCHASER shall take one sample of each 1,000 cubic yards of crushed rock material produced thereafter using approved AASHTO sampling procedures. PURCHASER shall submit samples to a certified laboratory or shall perform testing for gradation requirements using AASHTO T 11 and AASHTO T 27 testing procedures. Prior to testing, each sample shall be split, making one-half of the sample, with proper identification, available for testing by STATE. Each sample and the results of PURCHASER testing shall be made available to STATE within 24 hours of sampling. Any rock crushed prior to STATE approval to proceed shall not be credited to the required rock quantity. Any subsequent rock tests not meeting STATE specifications shall be reason for rejection of that portion of crushed rock produced after that test and shall not be credited to the required rock quantity. STATE may sample the crushed rock at any time during the operation. Results of STATE's tests shall prevail over all other test results.

Control of riprap and pit-run gradation shall be by visual inspection by STATE. Pit run shall be reasonably free of organic material and shall not contain an excessive amount of oversized (cobbles or boulders) or undersized (clay, silt or sand) particles.

The referenced sieve shall have square openings as set forth in AASHTO M 92, Woven Cloth Series. The determinations of size and gradings shall be as set forth in AASHTO T 27.

ROCK ACCOUNTABILITY

Subgrades must be approved by STATE prior to rocking. Rocking must be done only when weather conditions are acceptable to STATE, and must be suspended when muddy water could enter streams.

Rock accountability shall be determined by depth measurement. STATE shall be given 24 hours' notice prior to rocking.

<u>Depth Measurement</u>. Road rock shall be spread and compacted according to the depths specified in Exhibit E. Truck measure volumes are given, but shall not limit the amount of rock spread.

Depth shall be determined in the most compacted area of the surface cross section. If additional rock is required because of insufficient depth, it shall be added by truck measure to those areas that were slighted. The conversion from compacted yardage to truck yardage is 1.2 multiplied by the compacted yardage equals truck yardage.

The depth of compacted aggregates shall not vary more than 1 inch from the depth specified in Exhibit E. The average depth for each road segment shall be the specified depth or greater. Surface areas shall be staked by STATE.

Turnouts shall have a surfaced area of at least 44 square yards each at the depths shown in Exhibit E.

Turnarounds shall have a surfaced area of at least 73 square yards each at the depths shown in Exhibit E.

<u>Curve Surfacing</u>. Extra surface width shall be required for the inside of all curves as follows: 400 divided by the radius of the curve equals the amount of extra width to be surfaced at the depths shown in Exhibit E.

COMPACTION AND PROCESSING REQUIREMENTS

<u>Subgrade</u>. Subgrade surfaces of the road segments listed below shall be graded and compacted prior to rocking. Compaction shall be accomplished by traveling all surfaces from shoulder to shoulder until visible deformation ceases, or in the case of a sheepsfoot roller, the roller "walks out." At least 3 passes shall be made over the entire width and length of the road. A pass is defined as traveling a road section in one direction and then back over that same section again. Compaction shall be accomplished by using the approved equipment listed below or others approved by STATE:

<u>Fills.</u> Embankments and fills shall be placed in (approximately) horizontal layers not more than 8 inches in depth. Each layer shall be separately, and thoroughly, compacted. Compaction equipment shall be operated over the entire width of each layer until visible deformation of the layers ceases or, in the case of a sheepsfoot roller, the roller "walks out." At least 3 passes shall be made over the entire width and length of each layer. A pass is defined as traveling a fill layer in one direction and then back over that same layer again.

Placing individual rocks or boulders with more depth than the allowed layer thickness shall be permitted, provided the embankment will accommodate them. Such rocks and boulders shall be at least 6 inches below the subgrade. They shall be carefully distributed and the voids filled with finer material, forming a dense and compacted mass. Compaction shall be accomplished by using the approved equipment listed below or others approved by STATE:

COMPACTION AND PROCESSING REQUIREMENTS

<u>Crushed Rock</u>. The rock shall be uniformly mixed and spread in layers on the approved roadbed. Each layer of crushed rock shall be moistened or dried to a uniform moisture content suitable for maximum compaction and compacted in layers not to exceed 6 inches in depth. When more than 1 layer is required, each shall be shaped and compacted before the succeeding layer is placed. Any irregularities or depressions that develop during compaction of the top layer shall be corrected by loosening the material at these places and adding or removing material until the surface is smooth and uniform. Each layer shall be compacted with a minimum of 3 passes over the entire width and length of the road. A pass is defined as traveling a road section in one direction and then back over that same section again. Compaction shall be accomplished by using the approved equipment listed below or others approved by STATE:

Rock shall be compacted and processed during the same project period it is spread, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Rock shall be crowned at 4 to 6 percent unless otherwise specified.

COMPACTION EQUIPMENT OPTIONS

<u>Vibratory Rollers</u>. The drum shall have a smooth surface, a diameter not less than 48 inches, a width not less than 58 inches, and a turning radius of 15 feet or less. Vibration frequency shall be regulated in steps to 1400, 1500, and 1600 VPM, corresponding to engine speeds of 1575, 1690, and 1800 RPM. The centrifugal force developed shall be 7 tons at 1600 VPM. It shall be activated by a power unit of not less than 25 horsepower. The vibratory roller shall be self-propelled and operated at speeds ranging from 0.9 miles to 1.8 miles per hour, as directed by STATE.

<u>Rubber-Tired Skidders</u>. A rubber-tired skidder weighing a minimum of 20,000 pounds shall be operated over the fill layers so that the entire layered surface comes in contact with the tires. Skidders with oversized tires (high flotation) are not acceptable for compaction.

EXHIBIT F

ROCK PIT DEVELOPMENT AND USE


- (1) PURCHASER shall conduct the Operations relative to the disposal of waste material in such manner that silt, rock, debris, dirt, or clay shall not be washed, conveyed, or otherwise deposited in any stream. All waste shall be deposited at an approved "waste disposal site." Existing waste material on the floor of the North Fork Pit shall be end hauled to the waste site as part of the pit development and prior to crushing activities.
- (2) Where overburden removal limits have not been staked, they shall extend for a distance of at least 20 feet beyond the developed rock source. Overburden and woody debris shall be hauled to a designated waste area. Overburden shall be spread evenly, grass seeded, and compacted at the waste area and woody debris stacked separately. Prior to drilling or rock removal, completion of overburden removal shall be approved by STATE.
- (3) The rock pit floor shall be developed to provide drainage away from the rock pit. Rock pit drainage ditches shall be developed and maintained. Benches shall be constructed at intervals of 40 feet or less in height and shall be a minimum of 20 feet in width. Any gravel or talus slopes shall be left with a working face at an angle of 60 degrees or less. There shall be a minimum of 1 bench with an access road to it. Said benches shall be easily accessible with tractors.
- (4) Controlled blasting techniques shall be utilized for any blasting operations, and shall be accomplished using timing devices, delayed charges, low intensity shots, or other suitable means to contain as much material as possible within the quarry development area. PURCHASER shall maintain a comprehensive log that contains all pertinent data for all blasting operations. The blasting log is intended for STATE record keeping purposes only.
- (5) Pit face shall be developed in a uniform manner.
- (6) Oversized material that is produced shall be piled in a designated area adjacent to the pit. It shall not be wasted.
- (7) PURCHASER shall prepare a written development plan for the pit area. The plan shall be submitted to STATE for approval prior to conducting any operation in the pit area.

The plan shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) Location of benches and roads to benches.
- (b) Disposal site for debris and overburden.
- (c) Time lines for rock quarry use.
- (d) Erosion control measures.
- (8) PURCHASER shall schedule and coordinate quarry and stockpile usage with other existing or planned STATE contracts requiring quarry and stockpile usage.
- (9) PURCHASER shall notify STATE 5 days prior to the start of quarry development activities.
- (10) Upon completion of use, the pit site and access roads shall be left in a condition free from overburden and debris. Rock pit roads shall be waterbarred to provide drainage as specified in Exhibit H and blocked as directed by STATE.

ROCK PIT #2 DEVELOPMENT AND USE



CULVERT SPECIFICATIONS

All culvert materials shall be furnished and installed by PURCHASER, unless otherwise specified in the Contract. Culverts shall be constructed of corrugated polyethylene for sizes up to 36 inches in diameter. Culverts larger than 36 inches in diameter shall be constructed of corrugated aluminum steel. Culverts shall conform to the material and fabricating requirements of the "Standard Specifications for Highway Construction" prepared by the Highway Division of the Oregon State Department of Transportation. Corrugation types and shapes other than those meeting the above minimum Highway requirements, shall be approved in writing by STATE.

Watertight joints with gaskets are required for all culverts 60" inches in diameter or larger. Required gasket materials shall be in accordance with the minimum requirements of the Oregon Department of Transportation Drawing RD 326, or as approved in writing by STATE.

Culverts shall be located according to the alignment and grade as shown on the Plan and Profile, and/or as staked in the field, or as stipulated in special instructions.

The STATE Representative shall determine final culvert locations and stake the locations in the field prior to installation.

Culvert grade shall slope away from ditch grade at least 2 percent unless otherwise specified.

The foundation and trench walls for all culverts shall be free from logs, stumps, limbs, stones, and other objects which would dent or damage the pipe. The culvert trench shall be excavated 3 pipe diameters wide to permit compaction and working on each side of the pipe. Tamping shall be done in 6-inch lifts, 1 pipe diameter each side of the pipe to 95 percent density or over. Bedrock shall be excavated as required to provide a uniform foundation for the full length of the culvert. Minimum bedding depth shall be 6 inches.

A bedding of granulated material or crushed rock as specified shall be placed to provide a wide band of support and to transmit the load from above evenly over the entire length of the pipe.

Backfill shall consist of granulated material, crushed rock, or job-excavated soil free of stumps, limbs, rocks, or other objects which would damage the pipe.

Transporting of the pipe shall be done carefully. Dragging or allowing free fall from trucks or into trenches shall not be permitted.

Joining shall be done with bands of like material and corrugations. Manufacturers' instructions shall be followed for prefabricated pipe assembly.

Polyethylene joints shall be made with split couplings, corrugated to engage the pipe corrugations, and shall engage a minimum of 4 corrugations, 2 on each side of the pipe joint.

A manufacturer's certification that the product was manufactured, tested, and supplied in accordance with this specification shall be furnished to the Project Engineer upon request.

EXHIBIT G

CULVERT SPECIFICATIONS

Minimum height of cover over top of culvert to subgrade when road is to be rocked shall be as follows: 12" for culverts 18" to 36" and 18" for culverts 42" to 96" (add 6" for roads which will not be rocked). Minimum vertical cover for other designs shall be as specified by STATE.

Lengths of individual culvert sections shall be not less than 10 feet, unless otherwise provided for in special instructions.

The ends of each culvert shall be free of logs and debris which would restrict the free flow of water. The intake end of relief culverts shall be provided with a sediment catching basin 3 feet in diameter at the bottom. The outlet end of any culvert which would allow water to erode embankment soil shall be provided with a half round or other approved slope protection device. Construct lead-off ditches away from culvert outlets where the slope gradients restrict the free flow of water.

The intake end of culverts smaller than 48 inches in diameter shall be marked by installing a 5 foot long, painted steel fence post two feet into the ground, within 6 inches of the inlet on the downgrade side.

Culverts 36 inches in diameter or larger shall have 1:1 beveled inlets.

Tamping is required on all culverts. Backfills on culverts over 24 inches in diameter shall be compacted with a vibratory hand-operated or Backhoe mounted tamper.

All metal culverts scheduled for replacement shall become property of PURCHASER and be removed from STATE land in the same project period in which replacement occurred.

Half rounds shall be installed within 72 hours of culvert installation, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE. Steel posts used with half round installation shall be painted with rust preventative paint.




TANK TRAP SPECIFICATIONS




EXHIBIT J

TYPICAL CROSS SECTION VIEW OF ROAD VACATING SIDECAST PULLBACK



TYPICAL CROSS SECTION VIEW OF SIDECAST PULLBACK AND ROAD REALIGNMENT




EXHIBIT K

SEEDING AND FERTILIZING

This work shall consist of preparing seedbeds and furnishing and placing required seed and fertilizer.

<u>Seeding Seasons</u>. Seeding shall be performed only from March 1 through June 15 and August 15 through October 15. Seeding materials shall not be applied during windy weather or when the ground is excessively wet or frozen. Areas of disturbed soil shall be seeded by the end of the project period in which work was started. PURCHASER shall notify STATE 24 hours prior to seeding.

<u>Soil Preparation</u>. Areas to be seeded that have been damaged by erosion or other causes shall be restored prior to seeding. All areas to be seeded shall be finished and then cultivated to provide a reasonably firm, but friable seedbed. A minimum of 1/2 inch of surface soil shall be in a loose condition.

Application Methods for Seed and Fertilizer

<u>Dry Method</u>. Mechanical seeders, seed drills, landscape seeders, cultipacker seeders, fertilizer spreaders or other approved mechanical seeding equipment shall be used to apply the seed and fertilizer in the amounts and mixtures specified. Hand-operated seeding devices may be used when seed and fertilizer are applied in dry form.

Application Rates for Seed and Fertilizer

Seed listed below shall be applied at the following rates per acre:

Fertilizer: Chemical analysis shall be 16-20-0 and shall be applied at the rate of 300 pounds per acre.

Seeding will be considered acceptable when all other specified requirements in Exhibits K and L have been completed and a healthy, uniform, close stand of grass has been established, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

EXHIBIT L

MULCHING

This work shall consist of furnishing and placing required mulch. Mulch shall consist of straw that is free of noxious weeds.


<u>Mulching Period</u>. Straw mulch shall be applied within 24 hours of spreading grass seed and fertilizer.

Application Rates for Mulch

Place straw mulch to a reasonably uniform thickness of 3/4 to $1 \frac{1}{4}$ inches. This rate requires between 1 and $1 \frac{1}{4}$ tons of dry mulch per acre.

SUBGRADE WIDENING



Rocks shall be interlocking, with the largest rocks at the bottom of the fill, and the gradation changing from 48"-24" riprap to smaller riprap and then pit-run rock at the top of the fill.



FREE DRAINING FILL SPECIFICATIONS

<u>FABRIC SPECIFICATIONS</u> -Fabric shall be woven fabric designed for forest road subgrade surfacing purposes and shall meet or exceed the following requirements, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE:

(1)	Grab Tensile	300 lbs.	ASTM D4632
(2)	Puncture Strength	110 lbs.	ASTM D4833
(3)	Mullen Burst	600 lbs./inch	ASTM D3786
(4)	Flow Rate	18 gal/min/sq. ft.	ASTM D4491

Fabric shall be installed directly on the prepared surface. Longitudinal and traverse joints shall be overlapped at least 3 feet. Torn, punctured, or separated sections of the fabric shall be repaired by installing a fabric patch over the break prior to placing the surfacing course material. The patch shall be at least 4 feet larger in horizontal dimensions than the break to be repaired.

Protected Waters: North Fork Trask River, and Clear Creek, Type F streams of the Trask River Basin.

Location: Sec.'s 11, 13, 14, 15, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, T1S, R7W, W.M.

Activities: Road vacating on an unnamed road, portions of which are within 100 feet of Clear Creek,

a Type F stream. Culvert installation, road widening, grading and rocking the North Fork Trask Road, portions of which are within 100 feet of the North Fork Trask River, a Type F stream. Road widening, culvert installation and rocking of Clear Creek and Clear Creek Ridge roads. Two 60" culverts will be installed under 9-foot fills, and a portion of Clear Creek Ridge Road will be reconstructed where a washout occurred at the confluence of two unnamed tributaries of Michael Creek. A 48" culvert will be installed where another

washout of a Michael Creek tributary occurred on Clear Creek Ridge Road.

Protection Measures: Work will not be allowed from October 16 through April 30. No activity within 100 feet of

the protected waters or in-stream activity will be conducted before July 1 or after September 15 without prior approval from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Road closure activities will include barring traffic and grass seeding, fertilizing and

mulching disturbed soil.

All other areas of disturbed soil resulting from project work along the North Fork of the Trask, Clear Creek Ridge and Clear Creek roads, including fill slopes, sidecast retrieval slopes, cut banks and waste areas will be grass seeded, fertilized and mulched upon

completion of work.

Riparian Management Areas:

The area measured 100 feet slope distance from the high water mark on the North Fork Trask River, Michael Creek, Cedar Creek, Clear Creek and associated tributaries, that are designated Type F waters.

Protection Measures:

Yarding Systems, Layout and Stream Protection

Cable Yarding: When yarding with cables that are hanging within or across these waters, cables will be pulled out of the Riparian Management Areas prior to rigging the next yarding road. Yarding roads will be spaced an average of 150 feet apart where they extend over and/or through the Riparian Management Areas. When using ground based equipment in the Riparian Management Area for the purpose of providing a mobile tailhold, no equipment will be within 35 feet of protected waters. Locations will be selected to minimize the risk of sediment entering protected waters. Disturbed soil will be seeded and mulched following use.

Ground Based Yarding: During ground based yarding, all yarding activities, processing and loading will occur outside the Riparian Management Areas. An exception will be the yarding activities, processing and loading for Areas 1 and 2 along the North Fork Trask River Road in the N 3/4, SE 1/4, Section 24-T1S-R7W, W.M. Landings will not be within 100 feet of protected waters. Equipment will not be operated within 50 feet of protected waters. Skid roads will be located to minimize the risk of sediment entering protected waters. Disturbed soils within the RMA will be seeded and mulched following use. Operations will not occur from November 1 through April 30.
