HARVEST TYPE: This timber sale is a salvage operation of blown down timber located within partial cut stands from the John Day Point Thinning (341-04-03) and Walluski Stand Improvement (341-00-03) timber sales, consisting of approximately 228 salvage acres.

Area 1 – These stands were "auto-mark" partial cut about three years ago, approximately 67 to 72 years old, consisting of moderate-sized western hemlock and Sitka spruce and other mixed conifers. Wind storms have significantly damaged this stand, resulting in several large patches and scattered blowdown. These stands will be salvage logged, harvesting only those trees blown down and those that are root sprung (leaning).

Area 1A – This stand is located within Area 1. This stand will be logged to salvage downed trees and the anticipated blowdown of the remaining standing trees.

Areas I, II, III, and IV – These stands were "auto-mark" partial cut about four years ago, approximately 65 to 75 years old, consisting of moderate-sized western hemlock and Sitka spruce and other mixed conifers. These stands will be salvage logged, harvesting only those trees blown down and those that are root sprung (leaning).

Roadside Salvage: All blown down trees and standing trees which are leaning at an angle of 10 degrees or more from vertical, located within 100 feet of existing rocked roads located within the John Day Point Thinning and Walluski Stand Improvement timber sales.

SALE LOCATION: Timber Sale Areas are located in Portions of Sections 13, 24, 27, 33, and 34, T8N, R9W, and portions of Section 3, T7N, R9W, W.M., Clatsop County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: Areas 1 and 1A can be accessed via a rocked forest road off of Highway 30, located just east of Milepost 92, approximately 6 miles east of Astoria.

Areas I, II, III, and IV can be accessed via the Christian's County Road, near Milepost 5 on Highway 202.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

SPECIAL REMARKS:

SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SEE SECTION 2455.

Bald Eagle Seasonal Restriction: Felling and ground-based Operations in Walluski Stand Improvement Areas I, II, III, and IV shall not be allowed from January 1 through August 31, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE (Sections 2310 and 2355).

Timber sale acreages were determined by using aerial photos and GIS.

SALE OBJECTIVES:

This sale is aligned with the objectives of the NWO Forest Management Plan. The Plan presents guiding principles, a forest vision, and resource management goals.

Guiding Principles (in part) – To secure the greatest permanent value of these lands to the state, the State Forester shall maintain these lands as forest lands and actively manage them in a sound environmental manner to provide sustainable timber harvest and revenues to the state, counties, and local taxing districts. This management focus is not exclusive of other forest resources but must be pursued within a broader management context.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This salvage sale will take place in two recently completed sales: John Day Point Thinning and Walluski Stand Improvement. Because these sales have been logged since 1998, they are not considered to be suitable spotted owl habitat.

This sale contains potential habitat for marbled murrelets in Area 1 of John Day Point Thinning. There is no potential habitat for marbled murrelets in or adjacent to areas of the Walluski Stand Improvement sale.

Survey Results

Surveys for northern spotted owls are not necessary for this sale.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2001 and 2002 in Area 1 of John Day Point Thinning, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group¹. Murrelets were not detected during these surveys.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

A bald eagle nest site is located in Area IV of the Walluski Stand Improvement salvage area.

Operational Considerations

Seasonal restrictions are required from January 1 through August 31 for felling and ground based operations in Walluski Stand Improvement Areas I, II, III, and IV to avoid disturbance to nesting bald eagles. Only downed and significantly leaning trees will be removed from these areas.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2008. All timber should be felled by April 1, 2008.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale. However, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
