HARVEST TYPE: Area 1 is 420 acres of partial cut. Area 2 is 22 acres partial cut. Area 3 is 11 acres of partial cut. Area 4 is 8 acres of R/W. All areas are predominantly Douglas-fir with scattered hemlock. Minor amounts of cedar are present but are reserved from cutting.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Sections 20, 21, 22, 26, 27, and 28, T1S, R6W, W.M., Washington County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: The sale area is accessed via Turner Creek Road, then North Fork Trask River Road. These are currently rock roads. There are 2 gates along this route that may require a key or combination, which can be obtained from the Forest Grove District Office.

Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale does not contain potential habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2006 and 2007, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service¹. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers within 1.5 miles or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas within 0.25 miles of this sale.

Operational Considerations

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2010. All timber should be felled by March 15, 2010.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale. However, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract. Marbled murrelet surveys are not scheduled to be conducted within 0.25 miles of this sale at this time.
