ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Acreage was determined by electronic digitizing using 2005 digital orthophotography, 2008 Lidar and ArcMap 9.3 GIS software program.

Spotted Owl density surveys of the Elliott State Forest will be conducted during 2010 (Section 1520).

The 7400 Road south of the timber sale is Purchaser-maintained as shown on the Exhibit A. Log hauling on these roads may require additional rock as specified by State (Section 2050).

Create 181 snags by topping and girdling at various tree heights (Section 2335).

A fish log stockpile shall be created consistent with the specifications described in Exhibit I. Volume for the stockpile is estimated at 62 MBF (Section 2350).

Place 9 fish log structures in Fish Creek where cables cross the creek as shown on Exhibit I. Volume for log placement is estimated at 11.5 MBF. Logs for structures shall not come from fish log stockpile (Section 2350).

The sale area is designed to be logged during the dry season. Purchaser must comply with Winter and Wet Weather option if operations are conducted in the wet season (Section 2610).

Road layouts and logging plans must give priority to scattered green tree retention pods and protection of stream buffers. Logging plans must be approved by STATE before work can begin.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.



Habitat Conservation Plan Area

This sale is within an area covered by a Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) approved by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Incidental Take Permit (ITP) for the HCP covers northern spotted owls. Under the provisions of this HCP, surveys are not required for northern spotted owls.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2008 and 2009 using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group¹. Murrelets were detected as present in site 1 during two surveys in 2008 and one survey in 2009. One presence detection was reported in site 2 in 2009. Behaviors indicating murrelet occupancy were not observed in either year in site 1 or 2. In site 3 there were several observations of

marbled murrelets during surveys in 2008 including a subcanopy observation indicating occupancy. Site 4 had no observations of marbled murrelets in 2008.

A single survey in May 1994, by a contractor biologist in Area 1, recorded 56 total detections including two that were sub-canopy. Six follow-up surveys at that same station that year failed to detect a single murrelet. Numerous surveys in the vicinity in 1994 and in previous years also failed to detect any murrelets. ODF consulted with ODFW and both agencies agreed that the stand with detections did not appear to have a significant level of suitable nesting platforms, and that the detections recorded on the one survey did not indicate a nesting location in that stand. This consultation was formalized in a Memorandum of Agreement signed by representatives of both agencies. No occupied site was designated because of the lack of suitable habitat.

Known T&E Resources

As a result of subcanopy behaviors observed during surveys in site 3, acreage was added to an existing Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA) and the original sale area 1 was dropped from the timber sale. Survey sites 1 and 2 cover the current Double Fish sale boundary (sale area 2 was renamed as sale area 1 and sale area 3 was renamed sale area 2). The remainder of survey sites 3 and 4 were reconfigured for 2009 surveys for the Flying Fish timber sale.

Sale area 1 is within 0.25 miles of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area.

Operational Considerations

Seasonal operating restrictions will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually for sale areas within 330 feet of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area. Operations may be allowed from 2 hours after sunrise until 2 hours before sunset from August 6 through September 15, annually.

Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of explosives will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, for the use of explosives associated with rock quarries in or within 1.0 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat, and for the use of explosives associated with road construction in or within 0.25 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat.

Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of large aircraft (including Type 1 helicopters) will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, in or within 0.25 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat. Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of small aircraft (including single engine airplanes and Type II and III helicopters) will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, in or within 330 feet of potential marbled murrelet habitat. For all aircraft, overflights must be greater than 500 above nesting habitat."

Current marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2015. All timber should be felled by April 1, 2015.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale. However, ODF will be conducting spotted owl density surveys on the Elliott State Forest in 2010.
