The following Written Plan addresses how the operation will be conducted within the Riparian Management Area's (RMA's) of Significant Wetlands as described below and indicated on the attached map. The RMA extends the specified distance from the wetland boundary.

Riparian Management Area will be marked with blue flagging at places where RMA boundary is not the road.

LIVE TREE RETENTION (OAR 629-645-010):

This plan will address the interplanting of ponderosa pine established in 1968. Interplanted sites are overstocked and susceptible to insect attack. Interplanted areas will be thinned from below. The majority of trees removed from RMA will be in the 6 – 10 inch diameter class. These are the suppressed to intermediate trees in the stand and pose the most risk to stand health. This entry will leave at least 50% residual basal area on site (target of 100 – 120 BA all size classes included). Subsequent entries will focus on all age management. This plan will accelerate tree growth and health compared to standard RMA practice.

SITE SPECIFIC VEGETATION RETENTION PRESCRIPTIONS (OAR 629-645-020):

Retention will be site specific. All reserve trees will be marked by forester. The healthiest and most vigorous trees will be retained. Species preference will be ponderosa pine with a component of Douglas-fir and white fir for diversity.

SOIL AND HYDROLOGIC FUNCTION PROTECTION (OAR 629-645-030):

Cutting, skidding, and hauling operations will only be conducted when soils are dry. A temporary road will be constructed with an excavator across the wetland to access timber on the other side. No material shall be side casted during the construction of the road. No trees (larger than 3 inches DBH) will be removed from the wetland to construct this temporary passage. Road will be constructed when soils are dry. Logs will be placed in streambed to protect it from degradation. Logs will be removed after hauling is complete. Road will be blocked after sale is complete.

Trees will be felled directionally and whole tree skidded with minimal skid trails. Skid trails within the RMA will be flagged and approved by contract administrator prior to yarding. There is steep terrain to the north and south of the wetland. Two landings will be constructed within RMA. The landing to the north of the wetland will be constructed on a flat upland location. Any spot on this side more than 100 feet from the wetland is too steep to feasibly work as a landing. The landing to the south is only partially located in the RMA. This landing is located on the 40-7E-10.1 road. The part north of the road is within 100 feet of the wetland however, this part will only be used for decking of logs. Top wood from both landings will be removed to a disposal site away from the wetland. Landings will be hot logged to minimize landing size. Slash brought to these landings will be held to a minimum. Slash brought to landing will be piled and burned.

UNDERSTORY VEGETATION RETENTION (OAR 629-645-040):

Trees will be felled directionally and whole tree skidded with minimal skid trails. Many trees will be reserved in groups. These groups help protect understory vegetation as there will not be a reason for equipment to disturb the trees. Most trees will be mechanically harvested with a lateral reaching boom feller buncher which reduces the amount of ground disturbance.

SNAG AND DOWNED WOOD RETENTION (OAR 629-645-050):

Snags defined as an OR-OSHA safety hazard or designated fire hazard by State Forester will be felled but will not be yarded. Large cull trees will also serve as sources for future downed wood. All current downed wood will be left on site. Cull log lengths will be bucked and left for additional downed wood.
