<u>CLEARING.</u> This work shall consist of clearing, removing, and disposing of all trees, snags, down timber, brush, surface objects, and protruding obstructions within the clearing limits.

Where clearing limits have not been marked, the clearing limits shall extend 4 feet back of the top of the cutslope and 4 feet out from the toe of the fill slope, or as directed by STATE. Clearing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under road embankment sections. Clearing debris shall not be left lodged against standing trees.

GRUBBING. This work shall consist of the removal or digging out of stumps and protruding objects.

All stumps shall be completely removed within the limits of required grubbing. Grubbing debris shall not be placed or permitted to remain in or under any road embankment sections. Grubbing debris shall not be lodged against standing trees.

All blue marked trees along the 17 and 18 roads shall be cut and the stumps grubbed. PURCHASER shall exercise care not to disturb roots of adjacent reserved trees.

<u>CLEARING AND GRUBBING DISPOSAL.</u> Scatter through openings in the timber outside of the cleared right-of-way in locations designated by STATE.

<u>EXCAVATION.</u> Rock removal at Point V shall be performed prior to road reshaping or surfacing. A backhoe or equivalent machine with a hydraulic rock hammer shall be used to break and remove existing rocks in the subgrade. All remaining rocks shall be a minimum of 18 inches below the surface of the subgrade.

<u>SLASH PILING/SNAG REMOVAL.</u> Concentrations of slash located within 30 feet of the 17 and 18 roads in the timber sale area shall be piled at locations designated by STATE. Piling shall be performed by a shovel. Cut all lodgepole snags greater than 10 inches DBH within 75 feet of the 17 road from points A to E. All felled snags and recent down trees within this area shall be skidded to a location designated by STATE. Slash piling Operations shall be completed prior to grading and shaping of road.

<u>BLADE AND SHAPE EXISTING SURFACE.</u> The existing road surface, including shoulders and turnouts, shall be bladed and shaped to produce a surface which is uniform, consistent to grade, and crowned at ½ inch per foot of width. Outslope surface where crown and ditch is not applicable, as directed by STATE.

PURCHASER shall apply water during blading and shaping of roads.

<u>DRAINAGE DITCHES.</u> Ditches shall be "V" shaped, approximately 2 feet wide, with a depth of approximately 1 foot below the subgrade.

Suitable material removed from the drainage ditch shall be blended into the existing road surface.

LEAD OFF DITCHES. Construct and improve existing lead off ditches at locations designated by STATE.

ROCK ACCOUNTABILITY

The rock shall meet the quality and size specifications listed above. A sample of the rock shall be supplied to STATE for testing and approval prior to rocking. PURCHASER shall obtain subgrade approval from STATE prior to rocking. Rocking shall be limited to periods when weather conditions are acceptable to STATE and when sediments will not enter streams.

Rock accountability shall be determined by the following methods, as directed by STATE. STATE shall be given 24 hours' notice prior to rocking.

<u>Depth Measurement</u>. Rock shall be spread and compacted according to the depths specified above. Truck measure volumes are given, but shall not limit the amount of rock spread.

Depth shall be determined in the most compacted area of the surface cross section. If additional rock is required because of insufficient depth, it shall be added by truck measure to those areas that were slighted. The conversion from compacted yardage to truck yardage is 1.3 multiplied by the compacted yardage equals truck yardage.

The depth of compacted aggregates shall not vary more than 1 inch from the depth specified above. The average depth for each road segment shall be the specified depth or greater.

<u>Load Records</u>. Notify STATE before spreading the rock and maintain a record of all rock delivered for spreading. Make the record available for STATE inspection. A report listing the amount of rock delivered the prior month must be submitted no later than the 15th of each month.
