HARVEST TYPE: Area 1 is 8 acres of Partial Cut and Area 2 is 49 acres of Partial Cut, in a 77-year-old Douglas-fir stand. Area 3 is 3 acres of Right-of-Way.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Section 36, T3N, R5W, W.M., Washington County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: From Forest Grove travel north on Highway 47 10 miles and merge onto Highway 26. Continue on Highway 26 4.3 miles to Strassel Road which is just before Milepost 45. Turn left onto Strassel Road and continue 2.2 miles to Area 1. **The gates near Point K and Point L shown on Exhibit A may require a key or a combination that can be obtained at the ODF office in Forest Grove.**

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

**SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SEE SECTION 2455.**

**Pulp removal is optional.**

All felling on the Timber Sale Areas must be completed by March 15, 2016. (Sections 2310 and 2455). A 3<sup>rd</sup> year of spotted owl surveys will be conducted during the 2014 season and may result in a waiver of the early felling date.

No felling other than R/W felling may take place until September 1, 2014 (Sections 2310 and 2455). Project work may also be performed during this time period.

Construction of 300 cy. Stockpile required. Stockpile is a condition of Road Use Agreement with Stimson Lumber Co. and is not to be use for road maintenance (Sections 2120 and 2610).

Dust Abatement Required (Sections 2120 and 2130).

Equipment washing required (Section 2416).

Cost of Stimson trees removed: \$2,288 (Section 2120).

Slopes range: 10 - 45%.

Elevations range from 640 - 1,240 feet.

Acres were determined using ESR1 ArcMap GIS software.

Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

- (e) Understand that falsely entering into this certification is a violation of the Forest Resources Conservation Amendments Act of 1993 and OAR Chapter 629, Division 31, and is subject to any and all penalties contained therein.
- (f) Have not directly or indirectly exported unprocessed timber originating from private lands in Oregon in the last 24 months, **or if bidding only on STATE hardwood timber or logs, HAVE** exported unprocessed timber originating from private lands in Oregon in the last 24 months, but **HAVE NOT** exported unprocessed **hardwood** timber originating from private lands in Oregon in the last 24 months **and** meet the requirements of OAR 629-031-0010(2).

## Biological Survey Report

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### Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale is located in the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. By ODF policy, operational marbled murrelet surveys are not required.

### Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2012 and 2013, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service<sup>1,2</sup>. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

### Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2016.

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2014 and 2015. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
