The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. . In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

All wood from this sale will be <u>weight scaled</u> and converted to MBF as stated in Section 2020.

Felling operations associated with Areas II and III inside the seasonally restricted buffer (within 330 feet of potential suitable habitat) shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between 2 hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE (Section 2310).

Acreage was determined using a combination of GPS and the ODF-GIS system utilizing orthographic imagery and LiDAR data.

58 hours of machine slash processing is required on portions of Areas I and II (Section 2560).

Firewood sorting is required on surfaced Landings (Section 2365).

Surfaced roads are suitable for wet weather haul, however, wet weather yarding will require exclusive use of cable logging systems. Hauling may be suspended during periods when damage to the road subgrade or stream turbidity from road runoff might

occur because of weather.

Pulp removal is optional.

Habitat Suitability

This sale does not contain potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls or marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

Surveys for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

This sale is within 0.25 miles, but greater than 330', of a first year survey site with a significant observation of a marbled murrelet. Survey at this site will continue in 2014. This sale is within 0.25 miles, but greater than 330', of unsurveyed potentially suitable marbled murrelet habitat.

Operational Considerations

Felling operations associated with guylines inside the seasonally restricted buffer (within 330 feet of potential suitable marbled murrelet habitat) shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between 2

hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of large aircraft (including Type 1 helicopters) will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, in or within 0.25 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat. Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of small aircraft (including single engine airplanes and Type II and III helicopters) will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, in or within 360 feet of potential marbled murrelet habitat. For all aircraft, overflights must be greater than 500 above nesting habitat.

Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of explosives will be in effect from April 1 through September 15, annually, for the use of explosives associated with rock quarries in or within 1.0 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat, and for the use of explosives associated with road construction in or within 0.25 miles of potential marbled murrelet habitat.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has no plans for further survey of this sale. However, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract. In addition, marbled murrelet surveys will be conducted within 0.25 miles of the sale during the life of the contract.
