This sale is located in the Sun Pass State Forest (SPSF), near the edge of the range of the northern spotted owl.

Survey Results

Northern spotted owl surveys are conducted as a component of the Forest Management Plan for SPSF. SPSF was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 1999/2000, 2005/2006, and 2012/2013 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. were no responses from northern spotted owls during any year of survey.

Known T&E Resources

This sale is not affected by any known northern spotted owl activity centers or bald eagle sites.
