### Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

## **Survey Results**

This sale is in an area covered by northern spotted owl density surveys in 2013 and 2014. The density surveys were conducted using a modified survey approach incorporating aspects of both the density survey protocol (Forsman 1995) and the USFWS-endorsed survey protocol for spotted owls (USFWS 2012)<sup>1,2</sup>. There was a single observation of a Northern spotted owl in 2014 that was attributed to a known activity center greater than 1.5 miles of the timber sale.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2012 and 2013, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>3</sup>. Marbled murrelets were detected as present

during three surveys in 2012 and during two surveys in 2013. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed.

A survey waiver for marbled murrelets has been issued for tailhold locations that are outside of the timber sale boundary and are located in non-contiguous unsurveyed potential habitat. Disturbance protection measures for tailholds are required.

## Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

### **Operational Considerations**

Use of chainsaws within unsurveyed potentially suitable habitat is not permitted April 1 - August 5. Chainsaws may be used August 6 – September 15 from two hours after sunrise until 2 hours before sunset. Chainsaw use is unrestricted September 16 - March 31.

The following trees will not be selected for tailholds:

- Trees with potential nest platforms or immediately surrounding trees that provide cover to potential nest platforms;
- Known nest trees;
- The largest trees in areas where the number of large trees is limited;
- Minor tree species (not commonly found in the stand)

ODF Area Biologist or designee familiar with murrelet habitat and biology will inspect and approve each tailhold tree before it is used. Lead time of at least one week for all reviews or meetings with ODF representatives is required. No trees that are considered to be potential habitat or surrounding trees that provide cover to platform trees, as determined by ODF Area Biologist or designee, will be used for tailholds.

To protect trees used as tailholds, it is preferred that plates, nylon straps or other approved devices be utilized to prevent damage to trees. If this is not feasible, notching of the trees to prevent cable slippage will be limited to less than 1/4 the circumference of the tree.

No trees or snags will be felled within this unsurveyed patch.

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2017.

Marbled murrelet survey results for area 3 are valid until April 1, 2019.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2017.

## **Future Survey Plans**

ODF plans to continue spotted owl density surveys on the Elliot State Forest in vicinity of this sale. The continuing density survey coverage will be utilized in lieu of the spot check survey requirement. In the future, ODF will conduct density, operational, and/or activity center monitoring surveys for northern spotted owls within 3 miles of this sale during the duration of the contract.
