HARVEST TYPE: Combination of modified clearcut harvest containing 19 net acres of 37-year-old Douglas-fir plantation in Area 1, and partial cut harvest containing 76 net acres of 29- to 37-year-old Douglas-fir plantation in areas 2 and 3.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Section 30, T10S, R6W, and portions of Sections 25 and 36, T10S, R7W, W.M., Benton County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: From Philomath travel west on Highway 20 for 4.5 miles and turn right onto Kings Valley Highway (Hwy. 223). Continue north 6.4 miles along Kings Valley Highway and turn left onto Hoskins Road. Continue 1.8 miles on Hoskins Road and stay left and cross bridge over Luckiamute River on Hoskins Road. Proceed for 1 mile to Project Point A and turn left onto Bonner Creek Road. To access Areas 1 and 2, proceed approximately 1.1 miles up Bonner Creek Road, turn left on Fort Extension Road and continue 0.4 mile to unnamed spur and turn left and continue approximately 0.2 mile to Project Point B2.

To access Area 3, continue past Fort Extension Road on Bonner Creek Road approximately 0.3 mile to Project Point C1.

In order to compensate PURCHASER for Project Work, ODF will credit PURCHASER's timber account in the amount of \$36,061 after the project work is completed and accepted, as described in Section 2630, "Credit for Project Work."

The Timber Sale Areas contain negligible volumes of other logs to be paid for at the prices in Section 1740.

PERFORMANCE SECURITY: 20% of bid value (unknown) **or** the total value of the project work (\$36,000) whichever is greater, not to exceed \$500,000. Actual bond amount will be rounded up to an even \$1,000 unit.

PROJECTS: Road Construction (0.4 mile), Road Improvement (3.5 miles), and firewood sorting.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Acreage was determined using a combinations of GPS and the ODF-GIS system utilizing orthographic imagery and Lidar data.

Protect Bonner Creek Marbled Murrelet Management Areas (Section 1520 and FPA Written Plans).

All wood from this sale will be weight scaled and converted to MBF (Section 2020).

Portions of Area 3 within seasonally restricted buffers will have seasonal restrictions (Sections 2310, 2350, 2355, 2360, and 2610, and Exhibit D).

A permanent inventory plot is located within Area 1. Aluminum tags will need to be removed from bole of trees and reattached to the associated stump in the original orientation (Section 2310).

Firewood sorting required on surfaced roads and Landings (Section 2365).

Protect Tributaries to Bonner Creek and Burgett Creek, Type F streams (Section 2415 and FPA Written Plans).

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based yarding, earth disturbing, road construction, and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest Land and between State Forest Land sites are free of soils, seeds, vegetative matter, or other debris that could contain, or hold, seeds (Section 2416).

**Pulp removal is optional.**

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

## Biological Survey Report

### Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets adjacent to sale areas 2 and 3.

This sale does not contain potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls.

### Survey Results

Surveys for sale areas 2 and 3 were conducted for marbled murrelets in 2013 and 2014, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>1</sup>. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys.

### Known T&E Resources

Sale area 3 lies partially within the non-habitat buffer of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA). A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the MMMA has been conducted. It concludes that the Bonney Burgett Combo area 3 timber sale, as currently proposed, is expected to have a low risk of incidental take of marbled murrelets.

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

### **Operational Considerations**

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2020.

Felling operations in portions of Area 3 that are within MMMA buffers shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between 2 hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Cable Yarding Operations including the use of tailhold/guyline anchors in portions of Area 3 that are within MMMA buffers shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between 2 hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Ground-based Operations in portions of Area 3 that are within MMMA buffers shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between 2 hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

The use of mechanized equipment, including chainsaws in portions of Area 3 that are within MMMA buffers shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between two hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Non-Project Road and Landing Operations in portions for Area 3 that are within MMMA buffers shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between two hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Activities associated with Project Nos. 1 and 2 (Road Construction and Improvement) within MMMA buffers, shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5 or from August 6 through September 15 between two hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

All timber should be felled by December 31, 2017.

### **Future Survey Plans**

ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
