Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in area 1-3 only. This sale is located in the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. By ODF policy, operational marbled murrelet surveys are not required.

Survey Results

Sale area 1-3 were surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2013 and 2014 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed in either 2013 or 2014. Surveys will continue in 2015 to extend the contract duration.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Except for area 4, no felling, except for felling associated with project work, shall be allowed prior to the completion of the 2015 spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owls.

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Current northern spotted owl survey results for areas 1-3 are valid until March 15, 2017.

After the 2015 surveys are completed, the survey results for areas 1-3 will be valid until March 15, 2018.

All timber in areas 1-3 should be felled by March 15, 2018.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2016 and 2017. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and spot checks, surveys for other planned operations, and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
