ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

All felling on Areas 1, 1A, 2, and 3 (North of "Seasonal Restriction Line" as shown on Exhibit "A") shall be completed by April 1, 2017. All harvest activities for this portion of the timber sale shall be complete by December 31, 2017 (Sections 2310 and 2455).

All felling on Area 3 (South of "Seasonal Restriction Line" as shown on Exhibit "A") shall be completed by March 15, 2018 (Section 2455).

Ground-based operations will be allowed from November 1 through April 30 with additional precautions to protect streams, soil and road surfaces (Section 2355).

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in areas 1, 1A, 2, 3, and 4. This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets in areas 1, 1A, 2, 3, and 4.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2014 and 2015 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed in either year of these surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during three surveys at a single site in 2013. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed. There were no observations of marbled murrelets at the other survey sites.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Sale areas 1 and 2 are within ½ mile of both the Puma and Boulder Candyflower Marbled Murrelet Management Areas (MMMA).

Sale area 1A lies within the 100 meter non-habitat buffer of the Puma Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA). A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the MMMA has been conducted. It concludes that area 1A of the Quarter Mile timber sale, as currently proposed, is expected to have a low risk of incidental take of Marbled Murrelets.

Sale area 3 lies within 1/4 mile of the Boulder Candyflower MMMA.

Seasonal operating restrictions are required for this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2018.

On road segments 1A–1B and 1C–1D, operations shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5, and from August 6 through September 15 between two hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Operations in Area 1A including timber felling, ground based operations, and road construction shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 6 and from August 6 through September 15 between two hours before sunset and two hours after sunrise.

Marbled murrelet survey results for areas 1, 1A, 2, and the northern 270 feet of area 3 as detailed in the sale prospectus are valid until April 1, 2017.

Marbled murrelets survey results for the southern portion of area 3 as detailed in the sale prospectus are valid until April 1, 2020.

All timber should be felled in areas 1, 1A, 2, and northern 270 feet of area 3 as detailed in the sale prospectus by April 1, 2017.

All timber should be felled in the southern portion of area 3 as detailed in the sale prospectus by March 15, 2018.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will occur in 2016 and 2017. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
