Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale is located in the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. By ODF policy, operational marbled murrelet surveys are not required.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2013 and 2014. Surveys are ongoing in 2015 and will continue in 2016 to extend the contract felling date. Surveys have been conducted using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were observed on two occasions in 2014. These observations were determined to be from a non-territorial single (or "floater") owl within 1.5 miles of the timber sale. There have been no observations of northern spotted owls to date in 2015.

Known T&E Resources

While there are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting the timber sale areas, this sale does require the development of a quarry that is within 1.5 miles of a known

activity center. A Biological Assessment of the quarry development has been conducted. It concludes that the Feldshaw Quarry Development, as currently proposed, is expected to have a low risk of negatively affecting the persistence and productivity of the owl site.

There are no Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

No felling, except for felling associated with project work, shall be allowed prior to the completion of the 2016 northern spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owls.

Northern spotted owl survey results will be valid until March 15, 2019 upon the completion of 2016 surveys.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and northern spotted owl surveys, spot checks, and activity center monitoring may be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
