Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in sale areas 1–3. This sale is located in the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. By ODF policy, operational marbled murrelet surveys are not required.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2014 and 2015. Surveys are ongoing in 2016 and to extend the contract felling date. Surveys have been conducted using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2} An unknown *Strix* species owl was observed once in 2014. There were no observations of northern spotted owls in either 2014 or 2015. There have been no observations of northern spotted owls to date in 2016.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

No felling, except for felling associated with project work, shall be allowed prior to the completion of the 2016 northern spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owls.

Northern spotted owl survey results will be valid until March 15, 2019 upon the completion of 2016 surveys.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will occur in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
