ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

All felling in Area 3 must be completed by March 15, 2018.

Projects 1, 2, and 3 shall be completed by October 31, 2018.

Project No. 4 shall be completed by October 31, 2019.

Operations including timber felling, ground-based operations, cable-yarding operations, road construction, road improvement, and road vacating on Road Segments I3 to I4, V3 to V4, V7 to V8, and on portions of Road Segments 2A to 2B, and 3A to 3B as shown on the Exhibit A shall not be allowed from April 1 through August 5, and from August 6 through September 15 with daily timing restrictions.

If Tailhold or Guyline trees outside of the Timber Sale Area are necessary to facilitate Yarding Operations, PURCHASER shall acquire WRITTEN APPROVAL from STATE prior to their use.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets in areas 2 and 3. There is no suitable habitat in the rock source area.

Survey Results

Area 2 was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2014 - 2016 and Area 3 was surveyed in 2014 and 2015, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. An unknown juvenile *Strix* species owl was observed once in 2016. However, northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2014 and 2015, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during one survey at a single site in 2015. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed. There were no observations of marbled murrelets at any other survey sites.

Known T&E Resources

Roadwork is planned to occur within the buffer of two Marbled Murrelet Management Area's (MMMA). A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the MMMAs has been conducted. It concludes that the roadwork associated with the Rector Quad sale, as currently proposed, is expected to have a low risk of incidental take of marbled murrelets.

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Seasonal operating restrictions are required for this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Road improvement and construction within the Niche 11 and Sweethome MMMA buffers are planned to occur. The activities are seasonally restricted between April 1 and August 5, then allowed with daily timing restrictions between August 6 and September 15. Road segments with seasonal restrictions include all or portions of: 2A to 2B, 3A to 3B, V3 to V4 and V7 to V8.

Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2019 for area 2.

Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2018 for area 3.

Marbled murrelet survey results for areas 2 and 3 are valid until April 1, 2021.

All timber on Area 2 should be felled by March 15, 2019.

All timber on Area 3 should be felled by March 15, 2018.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will occur in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
