HARVEST TYPE: This sale is a combination of one clearcut unit totaling 42 acres and two thinning units

totaling 81 acres for a total of 123 acres. The timber is 77- to 101-year-old Douglas-fir and mixed conifer, with a large component of hardwoods. The sale is 16% tractor loggable and 84% cable logging with some road building and haul route grading. The

maximum yarding distances are 400 feet.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Section 36, T32S, R9W, W.M., at the start of the Kelsey Creek drainage

outside of Glendale in Douglas County, Oregon.

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and

management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a

threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in areas 1–4.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2014 and 2015 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were observed on four occasions in 2014. Three of these observations were attributed to a known activity center within 1.3 miles from the timber sale. The fourth observation was attributed to separate known activity center within 1.3 miles of the timber sale. Northern spotted owls were not observed during operation surveys in 2015. However, multiple observations at both known northern spotted owl sites occurred during activity center monitoring surveys in 2015. A third year of operational surveys is ongoing for 2016.

Known T&E Resources

This sale is within 1.3 miles of two northern spotted owl activity centers. A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the activity centers has been conducted. It

concludes that the Trappers Cabin No 7 timber sale, as currently planned, poses low risk of negatively affecting these northern spotted owl sites.

Operational Considerations

No felling, except for felling associated with project work, shall be allowed prior to completion of the 2016 northern spotted owl surveys indicating no new resident spotted owls.

If felling operations are not initiated by February 1, felling may not occur until June 30 of each year, or until northern spotted owl spot checks surveys are completed, whichever is first.

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2018.

Northern spotted owl survey results will be valid until March 15, 2019 upon the completion of 2016 surveys

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for activity center monitoring may be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
