ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Acreage was determined using a combination of GPS and the ODF-GIS system utilizing orthographic imagery and Lidar data.

Firewood sorting is required on Landings along surfaced roads in Area 2, and all roads and landings in Area 1 (Section 2365).

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based yarding, earth disturbing, road construction, and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest Land and between State Forest Land sites are free of soil, seeds, vegetative matter, or other debris that could contain, or hold, seed (Section 2416).

Machine slash piling is required on portions of the Timber Sale Areas (Section 2560).

Pulp removal is required if yarded to landing.

Log hauling on Salmon Creek Road and I3 to I4 is not allowed from December 1 through February 28 (Section 2455).

Construction and improvement of Road Segments A to B, I1 to I2, 2I to 2J, I11 to I12, and removal of R/W logs required to be completed by October 31, 2017.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in sale areas 1 and 2. Sale area 3 does not contain suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale contains suitable habitat for marbled murrelets in sale areas 1–3.

Survey Results

Sale areas 1 and 2 were surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2014 - 2016 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed in during any year of survey.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2014 and 2015 associated with sale areas 1–3, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected

as present during four surveys in 2014 in sale area 1. Marbled Murrelets were also detected as present during one survey in 2015 in sale area 2. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed. Marbled murrelets were not detected during surveys associated with sale area 3.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2021.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
