Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in sale areas 1 and 2. This sale contains suitable habitat for marbled murrelets in sale areas 1 and 2.

Survey Results

Sale areas 1 and 2 were surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2015 and 2016 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed in either 2015 or 2016.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2013 and 2014 associated with sale areas 1 and 2, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during two surveys in 2014 that were associated with sale areas 1 and 2.

Marbled Murrelets were also detected as present during one survey in 2014 in sale area 1. Behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed during surveys for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Current Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2019.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2020.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

Future Survey Plans

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
