HARVEST TYPE: Area 1: 111 acres of modified clearcut, removing approximately 36.8 MBF/acre of 80-year-old timber.  
Area 2: 5-acre modified clearcut, removing approximately 26.4 MBF/acre of 80-year-old timber.  
Area 3: Right-of-Way: Approximately 24 acres outside of sale boundary of Areas 1 and 2, removing a total approximate volume of 332 MBF, of 75-year-old timber.

SALE LOCATION: Portions of Section 30, T17S, R8W, W.M., Lane County, Oregon.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: From Veneta, Oregon, travel west on Hwy. 126 for 24 miles to Richardson Road. Turn right and cross the bridge; then turn left on Stagecoach Road and travel 5.2 miles to San Antone Road. Go 300 feet on San Antone Road, turn left at gravel stockpile. Take an immediate right on Beecher Creek Rd. Continue 1.4 miles to the Timber Sale Area (gate key required for access to Pat Ck. Rd. as shown on Vicinity Map).

PROJECTS: Construct and surface 21.35 stations of new roads. Reconstruct and surface 134 stations of existing roads. Pipe installation and fill construction through stream crossing, log debris removal from fill, roadside brushing for 0.73 mile, and a gate install.

FEES: Estimated Coos Bay Rail Authority railroad crossing fee, \$1,750.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Log hauling from October 31 to April 30 is subject to a "Loads/Day limitation during wet weather."  
Project work conducted between October 31 through April 30 shall be subject to approval by STATE in writing.

All felling on the Timber Sale Areas must be completed by March 15, 2019 (Sections 2310 and 2455).

Activity in "Live" Streams shall not be allowed from September 15 through July 1.

Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

## Biological Survey Report

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### Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

### Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2015 and 2016, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service<sup>1,2</sup>. Northern spotted owls were not observed during surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2014 and 2015, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>3</sup>. Murrelets were detected as present multiple times during the two years of surveys. However, there were no significant or "occupied" detections during any survey year.

## **Known T&E Resources**

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

## **Operational Considerations**

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2019.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2021.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2019.

## **Future Survey Plans**

ODF has entered into an agreement with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) known as a Safe Harbor Agreement (SHA). This agreement allows the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) to conduct a study on ODF managed lands which includes population reduction measures on barred owls to assess the impacts on northern spotted owls. This Contract contains sale areas within the USGS study boundary. Under this agreement, if nesting northern spotted owls are found in or within close proximity of the timber sale, the nest and surrounding area would be protected until fledglings leave the nest utilizing seasonal restrictions and other measures. In addition, ODF may take other actions including retaining and protecting trees in the immediate area of a nest tree.

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2017 and 2018. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and spot checks, surveys for other planned operations, and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
