The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

This sale will be surveyed for Northern Spotted Owl presence during 2018. No felling, other than felling associated with project work, may occur prior to September 1, 2018 (Sections 2310 and 2455).

Acreage was determined using a combination of GPS and GIS utilizing orthographic imagery and Lidar data.

Firewood sorting is required along surfaced roads and Landings (Section 2365).

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based yarding, earth disturbing, road construction, and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest land and between State Forest land sites are free of soil, seeds, vegetative matter, or other debris that could contain, or hold, seeds (Section 2416).

Guylines and tailholds located in the Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA) shown on Exhibit A require consultation with and approval by ODF Area Biologist or their designee. The ability to guyline or tailhold in this area is not guaranteed (Section 2350).

Approximately 27 acres of machine slash piling is required (Section 2560).

Pulp removal is required if yarded to landing.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

#### **Habitat Suitability**

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

#### Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2016 and 2017 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service<sup>1,2</sup>. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys. Surveys will be conducted in 2018 to extend the contract felling dates.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2016 and 2017, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>3</sup>. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys in sites 1 & 2. Marbled murrelets were detected as present in site 3 during one survey in 2016. However, behaviors, indicating occupancy were not observed. In site 4, marbled murrelets were

detected during two surveys in 2017, yielding an observation indicative of occupancy during one of the surveys.

#### **Known T&E Resources**

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Due to the significant observation in site 4 in 2017, a Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA) was created. This sale is adjacent to this MMMA. Seasonal restrictions are in effect for the use of chainsaws within 300 feet of a MMMA.

#### **Operational Considerations**

No felling, except for felling associated with project work, shall be allowed prior to the completion of the 2018 spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owls

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2020. After the 2018 surveys are completed, the survey results will be valid until March 15, 2021.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2023.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2021.

### **Future Survey Plans**

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2019 and 2020. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and activity center monitoring and surveys for other planned operations will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
