Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale is located in the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. By ODF policy, operational marbled murrelet surveys are not required.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2015 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. This sale was covered by ongoing density surveys beginning in 2016. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys.

Surveys for marbled murrelets are not necessary for this sale.

Known T&E Resources

There are no Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale. Project work will occur within the inner provincial circle of the South Fork Rock Creek spotted owl activity center.

Operational Considerations

Seasonal operating restrictions for the use of explosives will be in effect from March 1 through July 7 (or until it has been determined that northern spotted owl pairs are non-nesting or the nest has failed) for project work within 1 mile of a nest tree or activity center.

Northern spotted owl survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
