This sale does not contain suitable habitat for northern spotted owls or marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

No surveys are required.

Known T&E Resources

This sale is within 1.5 miles of a spotted owl activity center. A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the activity center has been conducted. It concludes that the Sweet Lass timber sale, as currently proposed, is expected to have a low risk of negatively affecting the occupancy of the spotted owl site.

Operational Considerations

There are no wildlife related seasonal restrictions for this sale.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations may be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
