HARVEST TYPE: **Area 1:** 76 acres of modified clear cut of approximately 79- to 81-year-old Douglas-fir, red alder, sitka spruce, and western hemlock, totaling approximately 64.5 MBF/Acre.

SALE LOCATION: **Area 2 R/W:** There is one acre of right-of-way similar to the timber description of Area 1. Volume to be removed in Area 2 is approximately 64.5 MBF/Acre. Timber Sale Areas are located in portions of Sections 20 and 29, T6N, R7W. W. M., Clatsop County.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: Area 1 can be accessed from Highway 202. Turn Northeast onto Ebsen Road at approximately Milepost 25, continue to Tidewater Loop Road. Turn left off Tidewater Loop Road at approximately the 6.5 mile marker on Tidewater Loop Road, and continue for 0.5 mile to the northeast corner of Area 1. Designated haul route is to the north across Greenwood Industries and out Tidewater Road.

**ENDANGERED SPECIES
ACT COMPLIANCE
STATEMENT:**

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no ESA violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT.

SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SEE SECTION 2455.

PURCHASER shall not haul logs from the Timber Sale Area from November 1 thru April 30 (Sections 2035, 2130, and 2135).

If felling operations begin prior to September 1, 2018 in Area 1 an early felling deadline of March 15, 2020 will be in effect. If no felling operations have begun in Area 1 by September 1, 2018 then no felling deadline is in place (Sections 2135 and 2310).

Project Nos. 1 and 2 must be completed by October 31, 2019.

Project No. 3 must be completed by October 31, 2020.

This contract requires machine washing to prevent the spread of noxious weeds (Section 2416).

Timber sale acreage was determined by using GIS.

Pulp removal is required in Area 1 if yarded to the Landing.

Elevation range from 1,000 - 1,300 feet.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2016 and 2017 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed in either year of these surveys. This sale will be covered by density surveys in 2018³.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2016 and 2017. These surveys were conducted using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys⁴.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

If felling, except felling associated with project work, begins prior to September 1, 2018, northern spotted owl surveys will be valid until March 15, 2020.

If felling, except felling associated with project work, begins after September 1, 2018, northern spotted owl survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2023.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
