ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE

STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management

measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

SPECIAL REMARKS:

NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

Acreage was determined using a combination of GPS and GIS utilizing orthographic imagery and Lidar data.

Firewood sorting is required along surfaced roads and Landings (Section 2365).

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based yarding, earth disturbing, road construction, and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest land and between State Forest land sites are free of soil, seeds, vegetation matter, or other debris that could contain, or hold, seeds (Section 2416).

Approximately 16 acres of machine slash piling is required (Section 2560).

PURCHASER shall obtain an Access Permit from Hancock Forest Management Inc. for use of the following road segments: Pts. 1 to 2, Pts. 3 to 5, and Pts. 7 to 8. A sample copy of the permit is available at the Philomath ODF office.

A key is required for access through the gate at Trapp Creek Road and may be checked out at the Philomath ODF office.

Guylines and tailholds located in the Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA) shown on Exhibit A require consultation with and approval by ODF Area Biologist or their designee. The ability to guyline or tailhold in this area is not guaranteed (Section 2350).

Pulp removal is required if yarded to Landing.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in areas 1 & 2 and marbled murrelets in area 2.

Survey Results

Suitable northern spotted owl habitat in sale areas 1 & 2 were surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2017 and 2018 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service 1,2. This sale is being covered by ongoing density surveys beginning in 20193. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys. The density surveys will be conducted in lieu of spot checks.

Surveys for marbled murrelets in area 2 were conducted in 2017 and 2018, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group⁴. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Tailholds and guylines may be used in the buffer of an adjacent Marbled Murrelet Management Area.

Tailhold and Guyline Use Restrictions

- The following trees will not be selected for guylines or tailholds:
 - a) Trees with potential nest platforms or immediately surrounding trees that provide cover to potential nest platforms as determined by an Area Biologist;
 - b) The largest trees in areas where the number of large trees is limited;
 - c) Minor conifer tree species (not commonly found in the stand)
- An ODF Area Biologist or a designee familiar with murrelet habitat and biology will inspect and approve all trees before each is used. Prior notification of at least two weeks for all reviews or meetings with ODF representatives is required. No trees that are considered to be potential habitat or surrounding trees that provide cover to platform trees, as determined by an ODF Area Biologist or designee will be damaged or harvested.
- To protect trees used as guylines, it is preferred that plates, nylon straps or other
 approved devices be utilized to prevent damage to trees. If this is not feasible, notching
 of the trees to prevent cable slippage will be limited to less than ¼ the circumference of
 the tree.
- If no suitable guyline or tailhold trees exist, operational equipment such as a Yoder, which does not require guylines, or a Cat, which may serve as a tailhold, may be used provided no un-surveyed potential murrelet habitat is removed or destroyed when using such equipment.

Operational Considerations

This sale is in a density survey coverage area. Northern spotted owl felling deadlines for survey expirations will not be in effect unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

There are no T&E species felling deadlines in area 1.

Marbled murrelet surveys for area 2 expire on April 1, 2024.

All timber in area 2 should be felled by April 1, 2024.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
