HARVEST TYPE: Approximately 73 acres of modified clearcut harvest of 47 to 88 year old Douglas-fir, with scattered red alder. The average net volume per acre is approximately 42 MBF per acre.

DIRECTIONS TO TIMBER SALE AREA: Travel west on Highway 20 from Philomath, make a left onto Salmon Creek Road, just west of MP 27. Travel approximately 3 miles and turn right onto Wolf Creek Road. Travel another 1.5 miles where the Timber Sale Area is on the East side of Wolf Creek Road just south of the bridge.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act () requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

SPECIAL REMARKS: **NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.**

Hauling on Salmon Creek Road is not allowed from December 1 through February 28 (Section 2455).

Acreage was determined using a GIS system utilizing orthographic imagery and Lidar data.

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based yarding, earth disturbing, road construction, and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest Land and between State Forest Land sites are free of soil, seeds, vegetative matter, or other debris that could contain, or hold, seed (Section 2416).

Firewood sorting is required along surfaced roads and Landings (Section 2365).

Pulp removal is required if yarded to Landing (Section 2045).

Approximately 12 acres of machine slash piling is required (Section 2560).

Project Work includes replacing a culvert in a live stream with a Fish passable culvert (Section 2610 and Exhibit D).

Project Work includes stream enhancement, consisting of log placement along approximately 1500 feet of stream adjacent to the Timber Sale Area. Placement of logs for stream enhancement may not occur without a STATE representative present to direct Project Work (Section 2610 and Exhibit G).

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2018 using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were not observed during these surveys. This sale is being covered by ongoing density surveys beginning in 2019³. The density surveys will be conducted in lieu of spot checks. Northern spotted owls were not observed during density surveys in 2019.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted in 2018 and 2019, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group⁴. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during multiple surveys in 2018 and 2019. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Project work for this contract will occur in a Marbled Murrelet Management Area.

Operational Considerations

This sale is in a density survey coverage area. Northern spotted owl felling deadlines for survey expirations will not be in effect unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Marbled murrelet surveys are valid until April 1, 2025

All timber should be felled by April 1, 2025.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract. Surveys for marbled murrelets are planned within ¼ mile of the sale during the life of the contract.
