ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

Felling prior to September 1, 2020 is not allowed.

Work on Project Nos. 1 and 2 may not occur until after August 6, 2020, except for grading, rocking, and brushing of existing roads.

No felling of timber, other than that needed for Project Work, prior to 09/01/2021.

Midpoint payment date is 2/22/2022

Log hauling on Sam Downs and Kilchis Forest Roads shall not be allowed between November 1 and February 28 unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE. Log hauling is restricted to 4 loads per day between March 1 and October 31 during periods of rain equal to or greater than 1/2 inch in a 24 hour period, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Work on Project Nos. 1, 2, and 3 shall not be allowed from November 1 through April 30, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Improvement work on segments A to B, C to D and M to N may not occur between April 1 and August 5. From August 6 through September 15, these activities may occur only from 2 hours after sunrise until 2 hours before sunset. From September 16 through March 31, these activities are unrestricted. Maintenance work, including grading, rocking, and brushing is not included in these restrictions.

Pulp removal required unless approved in writing by STATE.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Revised Biological Survey Report

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was covered by spotted owl surveys in 2018 and 2019¹,². Northern spotted owls were not observed in either year of these surveys. Surveys will be conducted in 2020 and 2021 to extend the contract felling date.

This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in 2019, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. The second year of surveys will occur in 2020. Marbled murrelets have not been detected during surveys to date.

Known T&E Resources

There are no Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

This sale is within 1.5 miles of a northern spotted owl activity center. A Biological Assessment of the sale's impact on the activity center has been conducted. It concludes

that the Kilches Saddle timber sale, as currently planned, poses low risk of negatively affecting the occupancy or productivity of the northern spotted owl site.

Operational Considerations

Felling Operations, other than that needed for project work, shall not be allowed prior to September 1, 2021, or the conclusion of Northern Spotted Owl surveys, whichever date occurs first, unless otherwise approved by STATE.

Work on Project Nos. 1 and 2 may not occur until after August 6, 2020, except for grading, rocking, and brushing of existing roads.

Project work on segments A to B, C to D and M to N may not occur between **April 1** and **August 5**. From **August 6 through September 15**, these activities may occur only from 2 hours after sunrise until 2 hours before sunset. From **September 16 through March 31**, these activities are unrestricted. Maintenance work, including grading, rocking, and brushing is not included in these restrictions.

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Northern spotted owl survey results will be valid until March 15, 2024 upon completion of the 2021 surveys.

Marbled murrelet survey results will be valid until April 1, 2026 upon completion of the 2020 surveys.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2024.

Future Survey Plans

Operational spotted owl surveys for this sale will occur in 2020 and 2021. Focused spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2022 and 2023. ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract. The second year of marbled murrelet surveys will occur in 2020.
