ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

There is a midpoint payment for this sale of 50% due on October 31, 2022.

Trees 10 inches or less are reserved. (Section 2240)

All pulp that is yarded to the landing shall be hauled. (Section 2045)

If openings less than 75 feet do not exist slash shall be scattered to a depth not to exceed 1 1/2 feet, as determined by STATE. (Section 2560)

To prevent breakage during yarding and to protect advanced reprod, logs shall be bucked prior to yarding. (Section 2310)

Designated skid trails shall be used to the greatest extent possible and all reasonable efforts shall be taken to minimize damage to the remaining conifer understory. PURCHASER shall limit skid roads and trails, and all other locations where soil is compacted or displaced to 10% of the ground yarded unit. (Section 2355)

Purchaser may request up to a one year extension to an existing ODF sale to allow for the timely completion of salvage operations. Sales that require T&E surveys will require a case-by-case analysis with the Division to ensure extension meets survey requirements. Purchasers can review the Biological Survey Report in their sold sale prospectus to get an idea on extension viability. Interest will not be applied to advertised volume hauled after the original expiration date. All other contractual requirements shall be and will remain in full force and effect.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and habitat for marbled murrelets within and adjacent to the sale.

Survey Results

This sale has been covered by ongoing density surveys beginning in 2018 ^{1,2,3}. Northern spotted owls have not been observed within 1.5 miles of the sale area during these surveys. This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in 2019 and 2020, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group⁴. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

This sale is in a density survey coverage area. Northern spotted owl felling deadlines for survey expirations will not be in effect unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Marbled murrelet surveys are valid until April 1, 2026.

All timber should be felled by April 1, 2026.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
