ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

SPECIAL REMARKS:

NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

Purchaser may request up to a 1 year extension to an existing ODF sale to allow for the timely completion of salvage operations. Sales that require T&E surveys will require a case-by-case analysis with the Division to ensure extension meets survey requirements. Purchasers can review the Biological Survey Report in their

sold sale prospectus to get an idea on extension viability. Interest will not be applied to advertised volume hauled after the original expiration date. All other contractual requirements shall be and will remain in full force and effect.

## **Habitat Suitability**

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

## **Survey Results**

This sale was covered by spotted owl density surveys starting in in 2018<sup>1,2,3</sup>. An unknown *Strix* species owl was observed one time in 2018. However, there have been no spotted owl observations within 1.5 miles of this sale during these surveys. Density surveys will be ongoing during the life of the sale contract.

This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in 2016 and 2017. These surveys were conducted using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>4</sup>. Marbled murrelets were not detected during any year of surveys.

#### **Known T&E Resources**

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

### **Operational Considerations**

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Northern spotted owl survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2023.

All timber should be felled by April 1, 2023.

## **Future Survey Plans**

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
