### Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in units 1, 4, 5, 6, & 7. Sale units 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, & 7 are adjacent to potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

### **Survey Results**

Sale units 1, 4, 5, 6, & 7 were covered by spotted owl density surveys in 2018<sup>1,2,3</sup> and 2019. 2020 density surveys will be completed on or before the end of August. Northern spotted owls have not observed during these surveys to date. Density surveys will be ongoing during the life of the sale contract.

This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in multiple years. These surveys were conducted using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group<sup>4</sup>. Sale unit 6 was covered by surveys in 2014 and 2015. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during one survey in 2014. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not

observed. Sale units 1, 3, 4, 5, &, 7 were covered by surveys in 2018 and 2019. Marbled murrelets were not detected during these surveys.

# Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

# **Operational Considerations**

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Northern spotted owl survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

All timber covered by marbled murrelet surveys in 2014 and 2015 should be felled by April 1, 2021.

All timber covered by marbled murrelet surveys in 2018 and 2019 should be felled by April 1, 2025.

# **Future Survey Plans**

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
