

It should be sloped to drain with a relief ditch through the down slope edge of the road. The trench shall be behind the berm for approaching traffic.

EXHIBIT E

SEEDING AND MULCHING

This work shall consist of preparing seedbeds and furnishing and placing required seed, fertilizer, and straw mulch. Straw mulch shall consist of straw that is free of noxious weeds. Apply seed and fertilizer to all waste areas, and bare soils resulting from road construction and road improvement. Apply straw mulch to all bare soils within 100' of streams resulting from road construction, road improvement and to all waste areas.

<u>Seeding Seasons</u>. Seeding shall be performed only from <u>March 1</u> through <u>June 15</u> and <u>August 15</u> through <u>October 31</u>. Seeding materials shall not be applied during windy weather or when the ground is excessively wet or frozen. Areas of disturbed soil shall be seeded by the end of the project period in which work was started. PURCHASER shall notify STATE within 24 hours of seeding and fertilizer application.

APPLICATION METHODS FOR SEED AND FERTILIZER

<u>Dry Method</u>. Mechanical seeders, seed drills, landscape seeders, cultipacker seeders, fertilizer spreaders, or other approved mechanical seeding equipment shall be used to apply the seed and fertilizer in the amounts and mixtures specified. Hand-operated seeding devices may be used when seed and fertilizer are applied in dry form.

APPLICATION RATES FOR SEED AND FERTILIZER

The seed mixture listed below shall be applied at 100 lbs. per acre. The seed mixture shall be comprised of the following:

SPECIES	MIXTURE	PURE LIVE SEED	GERMINATION
Annual Rye	33%	95%	>90%
Orchard Grass	33%	95%	>90%
Perennial Rye	34%	95%	>90%

<u>Fertilizer</u>: Chemical analysis shall be 16-20-0 and shall be applied at the rate of 200 pounds per acre. Fertilizer shall not be applied within 100 feet of streams.

Mulching Period. Straw mulch shall be applied within 24 hours of spreading grass seed and fertilizer.

APPLICATION RATES FOR MULCH

Place straw mulch to a reasonably uniform thickness of $1\frac{1}{2}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. This rate requires between 2 and 3 tons of dry mulch per acre.

EXHIBIT F

STREAM ENHANCEMENT INSTRUCTIONS

- (a) Stream enhancement operations specified in Section 2370, "Stream Enhancement", shall be conducted only during the in-stream working period of July 1 through September 15. STATE shall be notified a minimum of 48 hours prior to conducting stream enhancement operations. Stream enhancement operations from September 16 through June 30 will only be allowed if a written waiver is obtained from the ODFW and is submitted to ODF. ODFW will need a minimum of 14 days to process such waiver.
- (b) Stream enhancement operations shall create 5 structures created within "Equipment Log Placement Reach A" and 5 structures created within "Equipment Log Placement Reach B" as shown on Exhibit A. Structures shall be at least 100 feet apart and have a minimum of 6 conifer trees or logs at each location. Refer to Figure A for typical design example of these structures.
- (c) Trees or logs required for stream enhancement work shall be conifers obtained from within Unit 1 of the Timber Sale Area. Trees or logs shall be at least 16 inches in diameter at the small end and at least 40 feet in length and may have branches and root wads attached. Trees can have defects such as double tops, crooked trunks, heart rot, etc. as long as they meet the require size dimensions.
- (d) To create structures, trees or logs should be placed in a complex configuration, as directed by STATE, with at least one end on the stream bank as to simulate natural placement.
- (e) Equipment shall operate from the stream bank to minimize stream disturbance and will not enter stream channel. Turbidity shall not exceed 10 percent above natural stream turbidities as a result of work. Turbidity may be exceeded for a limited duration (per OAR 340-41), provided all practicable erosion control measures have been implemented. Oil spill response materials shall be on site before work begins.
- (f) Within Unit 1 of the Timber Sale Area, trees shall be felled, yarded, cut to length, and delivered to pre-designated locations within "Equipment Log Placement Reach A" and "Equipment Log Placement Reach B", as shown on Exhibit A. Trees or logs shall be transported by approved mechanized equipment to "Equipment Log Placement Reach A" and "Equipment Log Placement Reach B". Pre-staging of designated trees or logs may be allowed outside of the in-stream work period in areas approved by STATE.
- (g) Access trails shall be approved by STATE, prior to their use, to minimize disturbance to the Stream Buffer. Equipment transporting logs or trees to the sites shall take care to avoid damage to existing in-stream logs, riparian or other trees. Trees that are cleared to gain access shall be placed in the stream or used to block access trails.
- (h) Mechanized equipment capable of handling trees or logs that meet the size requirement with ease will be used for stream enhancement operations.
- (i) All access trails shall be thoroughly ripped or blocked to prevent access using large woody debris, slash or boulders, as directed by STATE.




EXHIBIT G

SPECIFICATIONS FOR BRUSH AND SLASH SHOVEL PILING

Description of Work to be Done

Areas designated for work under the contract shall be treated according to the specifications given below:

<u>Clearing</u> - Brush, logging Slash, and other debris shall be cleared from planting sites and piled in windrows or piles, so that 80 percent or more of the soil organic layer is exposed. All woody vegetation other than trees is defined as brush in this exhibit.

<u>Piles</u> - shall be located at least 75 feet apart and shall be no more than 75 feet long. Piles shall be located inside the sale area designated for piling and shall be more than 50 feet from any cutting edge, standing tree, or existing road. Logs that do not meet Section 2045 Log Removal requirements, and chunks, which are suitable for firewood shall be piled more than 25 feet away from Slash, near roads and Landings and alongside the road in locations designated by STATE.

<u>Protective Measures</u> - shall comply with Oregon Forest Practice Rules issued per ORS 527.610 to 527.992. Examples of protective measures are: (1) waterbarring tractor trails where necessary to prevent runoff toward streams; (2) not windrowing in streams or streamways; and (3) leaving Stream Buffers along designated streams.

Work specifications may be modified or waived only upon written notice from STATE.

EXHIBIT G

SPECIFICATIONS FOR BRUSH AND SLASH SHOVEL PILING

Equipment Type, Equipment Operation, and Conduct of Work

The specifications given below are requirements for equipment type, equipment operation, and conduct of work under the contract.

<u>Shovel</u> - shall be a track-mounted machine with a ground-pressure rating of not more than <u>6.8</u> PSI and a net horsepower of <u>85</u> or more. The machine shall be capable of a minimum horizontal reach of <u>26</u> feet and a minimum vertical reach of 16 feet.

 Log Loader – shovel: Grapple with rake attachment shall be a hydraulically controlled, with a 360degree continuous rotation, and tooth length on rake arm shall be greater than 14 inches long, unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Equipment	Rate	Acres	Appraised Value
Log Loader	\$200 / acre	80	\$16,000

<u>Operator</u> - must be experienced in operating similar equipment on land clearing operations, be able to operate the equipment proficiently, and pile the debris on the area as directed by STATE.

<u>Support</u> - including transport, other equipment, replacements, supplies, maintenance, and repairs shall be furnished as required to complete work; and shall be furnished without cost to STATE, other than as agreed under the contract terms.

<u>Work Scheduling</u> - work shall be accomplished only during dry weather conditions, and started within 14 calendar days after completion of yarding activities on the Timber Sale Area. Operations shall provide for continual operation until contract work is completed, unless interrupted by poor weather, fire closures, or other uncontrollable circumstances. Equipment breakdowns shall be repaired without undue delay, and provision shall be made for replacement of equipment to prevent prolonged delays. Piling operation shall not be allowed when operations might damage sites or affect stream flows. Any exception to these instructions must be authorized in writing by STATE.

STATE Representative - shall provide directions for the conduct of work according to specifications.

<u>LEGAL DESCRIPTION</u>: Portions of Sections 22 & 27, T1S, R6W, W.M., Washington County, Oregon.

<u>PROTECTED RESOURCE</u>: Middle Fork of the North Fork Trask River, a Type-F waterway that flows south of Unit 1 of the Timber Sale Area. Coffee Creek, a Type-F waterway that flows west of Unit 1 of the Timber Sale Area.

ACTIVITY: Cable logging lines hanging over Type-F streams.

DESCRIPTION OF THE AREA: Slopes adjacent to these streams range from 5% in the flood plane to over 80% immediately upslope. Streamside vegetation along these Type-F streams include mature Douglas-fir, western redcedar, and red alder.

PROTECTION MEASURES: The Timber Sale Boundary was posted a minimum horizontal distance of 115 feet from the protected resources. However, skyline cables may hang over these streams on opposite slopes or ridges to facilitate logging. When cables pass through or over the stream buffers all necessary precautions shall be taken to protect stream buffer components including: locating corridors at least 100 feet apart and pulling cables out of the stream buffer prior to rigging the next yarding road. Trees felled within the stream buffers for cable corridors shall not be yarded.

<u>PROTECTED RESOURCE</u>: Middle Fork of the North Fork Trask River, a Type-F waterway that flows south of Unit 1 of the Timber Sale Area.

ACTIVITY: Log Placement in Type-F stream.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF THE AREA</u>: Slopes adjacent to these streams range from 5% in the flood plane to over 80% immediately upslope. Streamside vegetation along these Type-F streams include mature Douglas-fir, western redcedar, and red alder.

PROTECTION MEASURES: Stream enhancement operations will only be done during in-water work period (July 1 – September 15). Equipment log placement operations outside this period will only be allowed if a written waiver is obtained from the ODFW and is submitted to ODF. ODFW will need a minimum of 14 days to process such waiver. Operations in stream channel will be limited to necessary tree or log placement, and all operations will be done during dry (norain) conditions. Buffer Zone disturbance will be minimized through route planning and limiting equipment movements to only those necessary to access the designated sites. Equipment shall operate from the stream bank to minimize stream disturbance and will not enter stream channel. All areas of bare or disturbed soil will be seeded with an approved seed mix (Exhibit E). Stream enhancement operations will be supervised by an ODFW employee or ODF Aquatic and Riparian Specialist.
