HARVEST TYPE: The Timber Sale Area is comprised of five Partial Cut Units, one Modified

Clearcut Unit, and one Right-of-Way Unit. Unit 1 (PC-M) is 49 acres, Unit 2 (PC-M) is 66 acres, Unit 3 (MC) is 53 acres, Unit 4 (PC-M) is 23 acres, Unit 5 (PC-M) is 17 acres, Unit 6 (PC-M) is 22 acres, and Unit 7 (R/W) is 8 acres. The timber in these stands mostly contains 37 to 48-year-old

Douglas-fir.

All access to the Timber Sale Area is on surfaced all-weather roads. From Forest Grove, travel north on Highway 8 to its junction with Highway 6. Turn left and travel west approximately 3.5 miles to Timber Road. Turn right and proceed north on Timber Road approximately 6.5 miles. To access Unit 6 and Unit 7, turn left onto Cochran Road. Continue on Cochran Road approximately 2.2 miles to Carlson Creek Road. Turn right on Carlson Creek Road and proceed for approximately 400 feet to access the southern portion of Unit 7. Continue on Carlson Creek Road for an additional 1.2 miles to access the southern portion of Unit 6. To access Unit 1 through Unit 5, continue on Timber Road for 3 miles. Turn left onto Highway 26 and proceed for 6 miles to Salmonberry Road. Turn left onto Salmonberry Road and proceed for 1.2 miles. Turn left onto Section 10 Road and proceed for 1.9 miles. To access Unit 1, turn left onto George Creek Road and proceed for 0.2 miles to access the southern portion. To access Unit 2 through Unit 5, continue on Section 10 Road for 0.2 miles to the junction with Wheeler Road. Turn left on Wheeler Road and proceed for 0.1 miles to North Lousignont Road. To access Unit 2 and Unit 3, turn left onto North Lousignont Road and proceed for 1.4 miles to access the eastern portion of Unit 2 and Unit 3. To access Unit 4 and Unit 5 continue on Wheeler Road for 1.5 miles to South Lousignont Road. Turn left on South Lousignont and

proceed for 0.2 miles to access the northern portion of Unit 4. To access Unit 5, proceed on South Lousignont Road for an additional 1.2 miles. Turn left onto an unnamed spur road and proceed for 150 feet to access the southern portion of Unit 5.

ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state

Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues. ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls. This sale does not contain potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was covered by spotted owl density surveys in 2021 and 2022 ^{1,2,3}. These density surveys are ongoing and are planned to be conducted during the life of this contract. A Northern spotted owl was observed on one occasion within 1.5 miles of this sale in 2021. Currently, the northern spotted owl observation does not meet the requirements for residency.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

This sale is in a density survey coverage area. Northern spotted owl felling deadlines for survey expirations will not be in effect unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

Future Survey Plans

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and surveys for other planned operations and northern spotted owl density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
