Felling Operations shall not be allowed in Unit 3, other than that necessary for the completion of Project Work, prior to October 1, 2022 (Sections 2310, 2455).

Log hauling from November 1 through March 31 shall be subject to loads per day limitations as determined by STATE (Section 2035).

Pulp removal is required unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Sale acreage was determined using GIS.

"Log Accountability" (Section 2015), "Log Measurement" (Section 2020), "Log Branding and Painting" (Section 2030), and Exhibit 'C' contain special language for pulp removal.

Directional felling shall be used near OHV trails in ground-based portions of Unit 3 (Section 2310).

Ground-based equipment shall not be operated on trails and skidding logs across trails only at pre-approved locations (Section 2425).

Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. # **Habitat Suitability**

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls in all units. This sale does not contain potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets.

# **Survey Results**

This sale was covered by ongoing northern spotted owl density surveys in 2020 and 2021<sup>1,2,3</sup>. Northern spotted owls have not been observed within 1.5 miles of any sale units during these surveys. In 2020 there was one unknown Strix observation within 1.5 miles of Unit 1. Density surveys will be ongoing during the life of the sale contract.

Marbled murrelet surveys are not required for this sale.

### Known T&E Resources

There are no Marbled Murrelet Management Areas or spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

# **Operational Considerations**

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Northern spotted owl survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued. If density surveys are discontinued at any point during the contract, survey coverage will be valid until March 15, three years following the last full season of surveys.

### **Future Survey Plans**

This sale will be covered by northern spotted owl density surveys during the life of the contract. These density surveys provide incidental survey coverage in lieu of spot checks. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required.

ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and surveys for other planned operations and density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
