ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE

STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state

Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues. ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

A gate key is required to access the Timber Sale Area and is available at the Astoria District Office.

Per Access Permit/Agreement (#314.041100) PURCHASER shall enter into a road use agreement which requires a payment by Purchaser to Weyerhaeuser of \$759.00. (Section 2120. Access).

Felling on portions of Unit 5 R/W (Roundabout Quarry) shall be completed by 3/15/2025 (Section 2455. Seasonal Restrictions).

Felling Operations in Units 3 and 4 shall not be allowed, other than that necessary for the completion of Project Work prior to September 1, 2023, or the conclusion of Northern Spotted Owl surveys, whichever date occurs first, unless otherwise approved by STATE (Section 2310 & 2455).

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls within and adjacent to all sale units. This sale has potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets adjacent to a portion of Unit 5 project work (Roundabout Quarry).

Survey Results

This sale has been covered by a combination of northern spotted owl operational and density surveys in 2020 and 2021¹,²,³. Northern spotted owls have not been observed during these surveys to date. Operational surveys will continue in 2022 to extend the contract felling date for Units 3, and 4. Density surveys will be ongoing during the life of the sale contract.

Potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets adjacent to a portion of Unit 5 project work (Roundabout Quarry) was surveyed in 2018 and 2019 as part of the Marbled Murrelet Systematic Survey Zone. These surveys were conducted using a protocol

developed by the Pacific Seabird Group². Marbled murrelets were not detected during any year of surveys.

Known T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers or Marbled Murrelet Management Areas (MMMA) affecting this sale.

Operational Considerations

Units 1 and 2 have complete density survey coverage and survey results will not expire unless density surveys are discontinued.

No felling shall be allowed prior to 9/1/2022 or until completion of the 2022 northern spotted owl surveys indicating no resident spotted owls for units 3 and 4.

Felling for Unit 5 project work will be allowed prior to completion of the 2022 northern spotted owl surveys.

Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2025 upon the completion of 2022 surveys for Units 3 and 4.

No end felling date is required for Units 1 and 2 if density surveys continue.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2025 for Units 3, 4 and a portion of Unit 5 project work (Roundabout Quarry).

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale at this time.

Marbled Murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2025.

Future Survey Plans

This sale has been covered by a combination of northern spotted owl density surveys and operational surveys. Spotted owl spot check surveys for Units 3 and 4 will be required for two consecutive years following the cessation of operational surveys outside of density compartments. If density surveys are not conducted, then spot checks will be required for the entirety of the timber sale. In addition, ODF has an active survey program and surveys for other planned operations and northern spotted density surveys will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
