ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT: The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

Project work shall not be allowed between October 31 through April 30 unless

otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Ground-based operations shall not be allowed during periods of high soil moisture as determined by STATE.

Log hauling from October 31 to April 30 is subject to a "Loads/Day limitation during wet weather."

Cedar is a reserved species.

155 live trees split between unit 1 and 2 shall be selected by PURCHASER and reserved from cutting

Chainsaw restricted areas are subject to seasonal operating restrictions (Section 2455).

A minimum of 50% of the estimated bid value shall be paid on or before 03/27/2022 (Section 1751).

All felling must be completed by March 15, 2023 (Section 2455)

Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2019 and 2020, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were observed on one occasion in 2019 and two occasions in 2020. These observations were attributed to a known activity center within 1.5 miles of the timber sale.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted for this sale in 2017 and 2018, using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected as present at site 1 in 2017 and marbled murrelet behaviors indicative of occupancy was observed at site 1 in 2018, which lead to the establishment of a Marbled Murrelet

Management Area (MMMA). Marbled murrelets were not observed in either year at site 2.

Known T&E Resources

This sale is within 1.5 miles of a northern spotted owl activity center. Since this sale falls within a non-baseline activity center as identified in the Safe Harbor Agreement (SHA) with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS), a Biological Assessment of the sale's potential impact is not required by ODF policy.

This sale is within $\frac{1}{4}$ of a MMMA but is not seasonally restricted.

Due to the significant observation in site 1 in 2018, A Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA) was created. The sale was designed to not be within the MMMA and is greater than 100 meters from occupied habitat.

Operational Considerations

Due to the presence of barred owls, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are not required for this sale.

Northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2023.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2024.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2023.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has entered into an agreement with the USFWS known as a SHA. This agreement allows the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) to conduct a study on ODF managed lands which includes population reduction measures on barred owls to assess the impacts on northern spotted owls. This Contract contains sale areas within the USGS study boundary. Under this agreement, if nesting northern spotted owls are found in or within close proximity of the timber sale, the nest and surrounding area would be protected until fledglings leave the nest utilizing seasonal restrictions and other measures. In addition, ODF may take other actions including retaining and protecting trees in the immediate area of a nest tree.

ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and spot checks, surveys for other planned operations, and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
