ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

ODF will modify timber sale contracts to allow purchasers who harvest after HCP permit issuance (expected in 2022) to harvest either (1) under requirements pre HCP to avoid take of listed species or (2) under the new requirements of the HCP, as applicable to each timber sale. If a purchaser chooses to harvest consistent with the requirements of the HCP, it will be the responsibility of the purchaser to comply with the HCP and permits, with assistance from and approval by ODF.

SPECIAL REMARKS: NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT.

SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

Pulp removal is not allowed and shall be pilled as firewood unless approved by STATE.

Gate key required and can be obtained at Western Lane District Headquarters.

If felling operations are not initiated by February 1, felling may not occur until April 15 of each year, or until northern spotted owl spot check surveys are completed, whichever is first.

Project work shall not be allowed between October 31 through April 30 unless otherwise approved in writing by STATE.

Ground-based operations shall not be allowed during periods of high soil moisture as determined by STATE.

Western hemlock and western red cedar are reserved species.

Project 3: Construct drafting pond shall be completed by October 1, 2022

A minimum of 40% of the estimated bid value shall be paid on or before 02/23/2023 (Section 1751).

Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Habitat Suitability

This sale contains potentially suitable habitat for northern spotted owls and marbled murrelets.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for northern spotted owls in 2020 and 2021, using a protocol endorsed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service^{1,2}. Northern spotted owls were observed twice during these surveys and attributed to known activity centers within 1.5 miles of this sale.

Surveys for marbled murrelets were conducted for this sale in 2018 and 2019, and 2020 and 2021 using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group³. Marbled murrelets were detected as present during surveys in 2021. However, behaviors indicating occupancy were not observed.

Known T&E Resources

This sale is within 1.5 miles of a northern spotted owl activity center. Since this sale falls within a non-baseline thiessen as identified in the Safe Harbor Agreement (SHA) with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS), a Biological Assessment of the sale's potential impact is not required by ODF policy.

Operational Considerations

Due to northern spotted owl detections at a resident-status AC within the survey area, felling restrictions for spotted owl spot check surveys are required for this sale. If felling does not occur before February 1, 2022, felling restrictions will be in place until northern spotted owl spot check surveys have concluded on or close to April 15, 2022. If felling does not occur before February 1, 2023, felling restrictions will be in place until northern spotted owl spot check surveys have concluded on or close to April 15, 2023.

Current northern spotted owl survey results are valid until March 15, 2024.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2025.

All timber should be felled by March 15, 2024.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has entered into an agreement with the USFWS known as a SHA. This agreement allows the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) to conduct a study on ODF managed lands which includes population reduction measures on barred owls to assess the impacts on northern spotted owls. This Contract contains sale areas within the USGS study boundary. Under this agreement, if nesting northern spotted owls are found in or within close proximity of the timber sale, the nest and surrounding area would be protected until fledglings leave the nest utilizing seasonal restrictions and other measures. In addition, ODF may take other actions including retaining and protecting trees in the immediate area of a nest tree.

Spotted owl spot check surveys for this timber sale will be required in 2022 and 2023. In addition, ODF has an active northern spotted owl survey program and spot checks, surveys for other planned operations, and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.
