ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT COMPLIANCE STATEMENT:

The Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) is engaged in an active threatened and endangered (T&E) species survey program. Surveys, determinations, and management measures are developed and implemented in good faith compliance with federal and state Endangered Species Act (ESA) requirements. Restrictions on operations due to T&E species considerations are included in the prospectus. Purchasers are required to comply with all federal and state laws, including the Endangered Species Act. Purchaser should take steps to be certain that no violations occur. Prospective purchasers of timber sales are reminded that ODF surveying efforts may take place any time during the term of a timber sale contract. In some cases, ODF may require that initiation of operations be delayed to allow for completion of spot check surveys, as recommended by the USFWS survey protocol and required by ODF policy. As part of the survey program, ODF surveys its lands on a continuing basis for land management, species protection, research, and other reasons. During the contract term, T&E survey work and/or the discovery of a threatened or endangered species within or in the vicinity of a timber sale may affect operations contemplated under the contract. Also, legal challenges and other litigation regarding ODF threatened and endangered species related processes may occur and may affect operations contemplated under the contract. In the event a threatened or endangered species is found within or near this sale, or efforts are required to respond to legal issues, ODF may take steps necessary to protect the interests of the State, including contract alteration, suspension, or termination.

ODF will modify timber sale contracts to allow purchasers who harvest after HCP permit issuance (expected in 2022) to harvest either (1) under requirements pre HCP to avoid take of listed species or (2) under the new requirements of the HCP, as applicable to each timber sale. If a purchaser chooses to harvest consistent with the requirements of the HCP, it will be the responsibility of the purchaser to comply with the HCP and permits, with assistance from and approval by ODF.

SPECIAL REMARKS:

NO PERSONAL OR COMPANY CHECKS ACCEPTED FOR THE BID DEPOSIT. SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS APPLY - SECTION 2455.

Portions of Unit 2 are located within the seasonally restricted buffer of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA). Seasonal restrictions, protection requirements and consultation with STATE shall apply. (Sections 2350 and 2455).

Tailholds located in the Marbled Murrelet Management Areas (MMMA) shown on Exhibit A require consultation with and approval by ODF Area Biologist or their designee. The ability to Tailhold in the occupied Habitat portion of the MMMA is not guaranteed. (Section 2350).

PURCHASER shall complete a Road Use Permit from Weyerhaeuser Timber Holdings, Inc. (WTHI) for use of road segments Points A to B, 16 to 17 and 18 to 19. A sample copy of the permit is available at the Philomath ODF office. Purchaser shall pay \$3,850 to WTHI for timber located between the "Right-of-Way Boundary" signs on Points A to B, 16 to 17 and in the WTHI cutout area. (Section 2120).

Project work on Road Segment Pts. 18 to 19 requires coordination with Weyerhaeuser Timber Holdings, Inc. on timing of improvement work. (Section 2620).

A key is required for access through the gate shown on Exhibit A and may be checked out at the Philomath office.

Acreage was determined using a combination of GPS and GIS utilizing orthographic imagery and LiDAR data.

Firewood sorting is required along all surfaced roads and Landings. (Section 2365).

Section 2020 "Log Measurement - Sawlogs" contains weight scale sample language.

PURCHASER shall ensure all ground-based Yarding, earth disturbing, road construction and road maintenance equipment moved onto State Forest land and between Sate Forest land sites are free of soil, seeds, vegetation matter or other debris that could contain, or hold, seeds. (Section 2416).

Pulp removal is required if yarded to Landing.

The information shown on the Exhibit A map(s) are approximate locations. Exact locations of features represented by map symbols shall be determined on site and shall depend upon the conditions that exist on site. Activities shall be conducted based upon features determined on site rather than features shown on maps.

Habitat Suitability

There is potentially suitable habitat for marbled murrelets adjacent to this sale. This sale does not contain suitable habitat for northern spotted owls.

Survey Results

This sale was surveyed for marbled murrelets in 2020 and 2021 using a protocol developed by the Pacific Seabird Group¹. There were multiple marbled murrelet presence only observations during these surveys adjacent to Unit 1, and multiple observations including behaviors indicating occupancy adjacent to Unit 2. This led to the designation of a Marbled Murrelet Management Area (MMMA).

Know T&E Resources

There are no northern spotted owl activity centers affecting this sale.

Portions of this sale are within a MMMA buffer. A Biological Assessment has been conducted and evaluated by the USFWS and they concluded the risk of incidental take of marbled murrelets is low. This sale was also reviewed by the ODFW for compliance with the State Survival Guidelines. The ODFW found that this timber sale meets the Survival Guidelines and focuses on measures to minimize the potential for unauthorized take of marbled murrelets.

Operational Considerations

Seasonal restrictions apply to Unit 2. No timber should be felled before August 6, 2021, with daily timing restrictions in effect until September 15.

Marbled murrelet survey results are valid until April 1, 2027 for all sale units.

All timber should be felled by April 1, 2027 for all sale units.

Restrictions and Requirements for Construction and Improvement of Roads and Landings in Buffers

No construction of landings will occur within the designated occupied habitat (DOH) of the MMMA's. Construction of roads, improvement of roads and landings, and logging activities in MMMA's and at landings in buffers are seasonally restricted (from April 1 through August 5, then with daily timing restriction from August 6 through September 15) to prevent disturbance to nesting murrelets in DOH.

Tailhold and Guyline Use Restrictions

- The following trees will not be selected for guylines or tailholds:
 - a) Trees with potential nest platforms or immediately surrounding trees that provide cover to potential nest platforms as determined by an Area Biologist;
 - b) When feasible, the largest trees in areas where the number of large trees is limited;
 - c) When feasible, minor conifer tree species (not commonly found in the stand)
- An ODF Area Biologist or a designee familiar with murrelet habitat and biology
 will inspect and approve all trees, within MMMA's, before each is used. Prior
 notification of at least two weeks for all reviews or meetings with ODF
 representatives is required. No trees that are considered to be potential habitat or
 surrounding trees that provide cover to platform trees, as determined by an ODF
 Area Biologist or designee will be damaged or harvested.
- To protect trees used as guylines, it is preferred that plates, nylon straps or other approved devices be utilized to prevent damage to trees. If this is not feasible, notching of the trees to prevent cable slippage will be limited to less than ¼ the circumference of the tree.

• If no suitable guyline or tailhold trees exist, operational equipment such as a Yoder, which does not require guylines, or a Cat, which may serve as a tailhold, may be used provided no un-surveyed potential murrelet habitat is removed or destroyed when using such equipment.

Future Survey Plans

ODF has an active survey program and spotted owl density surveys, surveys for other planned operations and activity center monitoring will be conducted within 3 miles of this sale during the life of the contract.

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
